Welcome and Introductions

Chair welcomed partners and noted apologies. An update was provided on funding confirmed in the Mayor's budget for Project ADDER and Operation Yamata.

Actions

Circulated actions were confirmed, and updates were provided to action 1.13 and 1.18.

Diverting Drug Users from the Criminal Justice System

MOPAC's Criminal Justice Programme Manager presented on upcoming legislative changes that aimed to divert drug users from the criminal justice system. Members reflected on how this would intersect with treatment services and the possible impact this could have on provision. Discussion was also had on monitoring and recording compliance and how best to engage users in successful diversion.

Workforce Challenges

Office for Health Improvement and Disparities' Head of Alcohol, Drugs and Tobacco (London) presented to members on the workforce challenges the treatment services sector was experiencing, and outlined details of a London task and finishing group that was being set up to drive a regional response. The work of the task and finishing group would address

recruitment, training, staff development, retainment, increasing the skills mix in treatment and recovery services, and improving service quality. Members discussed the various barriers the industry faced, particularly in terms of pay and the breadth of the market, both nationally and regionally, and reflected that a more long-term plan would be needed to address the issue. Members agreed to continue to work collectively to resolve the challenges.

London Drugs Problem Profile
