It is considered that disclosure of this information would contravene the first data protection principle under Article 5(1) of GDPR which states that Personal data must be processed lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner in relation to the data subject.

Dear Mayor,

As members of the C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group, we know our cities play a pivotal role in tackling climate change and delivering improvements to local air quality. I believe one of the most effective ways of doing this would be for cities to transition their bus fleets away from diesel to new zero emission technologies.

As such, I will soon announce my commitment to stop procuring diesel buses and only procure hybrid or zero-emission buses from 2018, and I am writing to you and the Mayors of 27 other cities around the world to ask if you too will join me by making a similar commitment.

We know that making joint commitments work – the C40 Clean Bus Declaration helped reduce the premium that London and other cities pay for hybrid buses by about 10 per cent. If cities act together now on the issue of diesel buses it will start a race to the top in clean bus technology by promoting zero emission battery, electric or hydrogen fuel cell buses. I appreciate that cities would need to meet their objectives over different timescales, but a joint commitment will show leadership, inspire our citizens and send a strong message to bus manufacturers about our determination to radically reduce emissions.

In order to give momentum to this agenda I will host an International Zero Emission Bus Conference on 30 November 2016 at City Hall in London, to which I plan to invite senior representatives from Los Angeles to attend. I would be most grateful if you could write to me before this Conference to confirm whether or not you are able to make a commitment to stop procuring diesel buses by a certain date, and authorising the representatives from your city to discuss how we can best work together to achieve our goals.

It is with great excitement that I write to inform you of my candidacy for C40 Chair to succeed Mayor Anne Hidalgo.

Los Angeles has been a member of C40 since 2005, and I have served on the Steering Committee since 2013. C40 is part of the foundation of climate action in Los Angeles, and it would be my honor to lead the organization at a critical time and ensure that all member cities are benefitting from its great work.

In 2015, I released L.A.'s first ever Sustainable City pLAn. It was the first of its kind to integrate climate action across all elements of city policy and planning, and tie the environment together with equity and the economy. It provided a mix of near-term and long-term targets and within the first 3 years, we hit 90% of our 2017 goals. For example, we have more electric vehicle charging stations than any city in America and we passed the most comprehensive energy and water efficiency reporting rules in the country. We have much to share, and we continue to learn even more from our C40 peers.

No organization or network has done more to help L.A. meet its goals and act with greater ambition than C40. I am eager to give back to the organization and partner cities while continuing to push ourselves to go further at home. We have shared our funding and support measures, our reopening plans, new economic data, accelerated public realm improvements and public confidence campaigns.

Every year, the Forum hosts an annual Summit, bringing together Deputy Mayors and Commissioners for Culture from 40 world cities. This year, on 29 October, we will be bringing together our world cities for our Global Conversation, a one-day digital conference on culture, COVID-19 and cities. The flagship session will be a public panel, 'Global Mayors: Cultural Leadership through Crisis', which I am delighted to invite you to take part in, alongside four other world city Mayors.

It is a chance to advocate for the role of culture in recovery, reflect on learnings from your response to COVID-19 and make the case for investment in culture. We will be inviting the public from across the world to attend virtually – reaching a truly global audience at this critical time for culture and cities.

Your economic recovery task force supporting local arts and culture is a key example of leadership that we would like to share and celebrate with our global audience. As a former host of the World Cities Culture Summit, San Francisco also has a particularly powerful voice within the network, so I would be delighted if we can come together to amplify the solutions to protect and support culture in our cities.

I'm writing to you to invite Washington to join the World Cities Culture Forum – the world's premier global leadership network for culture.

The World Cities Culture Forum is made up of cities that demonstrate global leadership on culture. Its members – senior leaders from city governments – are some of the most informed and influential cultural officials in the world. They know that culture is a vital part of urban policy, driving a city's reputation, economic prosperity and quality of life.

Founded in 2012 by London, New York, Shanghai, Tokyo, Sydney and Istanbul, the Forum has grown to include 33 member cities in Africa, Asia, Australasia, Europe, and North & South America. By sharing knowledge, expertise and collaborating with each other, the Forum helps members to make culture a leading force in their cities.

At the heart of the Forum's activity is the annual Summit. Last year, member cities met in Moscow for three days of inspired discussion, sharing challenges and new ideas. Previous gatherings have taken place in London, Shanghai, Amsterdam, Istanbul and Buenos Aires.

All members are invited to the summit which will be hosted by Seoul, South Korea, from 1 to 3 November 2017.

Evidence is essential if we are to make the case for culture. So our work is underpinned by an extensive research programme and online presence.
