POLICE AND CRIME PLAN – APPROACH AND PRINCIPLES

PRINCIPLES

- Smart commissioning
- Local delivery
- Transparency and engagement
- Outcome focused interventions based on what works (inc. payment by results)
- Teamwork

APPROACH

- Four year strategy, with annual revisions. Detailed action plan for year one.
- Headlines to be developed to include what will be delivered, how and by when
- Plans to be based on clear evidence base and support from academics and advisors

CRIME PREVENTION AND REDUCTION

FOCUSING ON:

PEOPLE

Empowering the public to support the police:

- Safer Neighbourhood Boards
- Developing Neighbourhood Watch across London (and off shoots such as Pub Watch)
- Easier/better crime reporting

Supporting Victims

- Developing strategies aimed at reducing repeat victimisation

Building on the volunteering legacy from the Olympics

- Increasing the number of Special Constables to 10k
- Doubling the number of police cadets
- Increasing the number of Met Volunteers

Improving the connection between the police and the public

- Developing the role of the safer schools officers
- Establishing a Museum
- Changing the role of safer neighbourhood teams

PLACES

Tackling crime hotspots, developing new approaches to targeted intervention and using the whole range of tools available e.g. Late Night Levy.

Hotspot maps to be created for:

- Alcohol
- Prostitution
- Business crime
- Street violence
- Burglary
- Transport

Improving visibility

- Moving officers to the front line
- Strengthening safer neighbourhood teams

Using technology to design out crime

- CCTV
- ANPR

PROBLEMS

Developing prevention strategies:

- Drugs
- Alcohol
- Violence against women
- Gangs

Establishing an evidence base through a new London Crime Prevention Council

POLICE PERFORMANCE AND RESOURCES

DRIVE DOWN CRIME

- **20% Reduction in key neighbourhood crimes**
- New models of policing focused on visibility and productivity (inc. maintaining 32k police officers)
- Strong enforcement e.g. Trident
- Taking business crime seriously (from fraud to night-time economy)
- A strong focus on serious and organised crime as well as counter-terrorism
- Focusing on Violence against Women
- Maintaining public order

BOOST CONFIDENCE

20% Improvement in confidence in the MPS by:

- Focusing on the victim and improving services to victims
- Rooting out corruption and responding to Leveson
- Ensuring fair treatment (professional standards, stop and search, addressing the BME confidence gap)
- Building a police force that looks like the City it serves (direct entry, recruitment and progression)

CUT COSTS

Cut the budget by 20%:

- **Reduce** unnecessary overheads, remove duplication and back office waste
- **Release** under-utilised assets
- **Reform** the MPS policing model and reducing the number of managers and supervisors whilst increasing the numbers of police officers in warranted and frontline roles

JUSTICE AND RESETTLEMENT

REFORM

- Reforming criminal justice agencies and where relevant, the MPS to deliver swift and sure justice, efficiencies and most importantly better victim satisfaction

REHABILITATION

- Improving support for victims across criminal justice system
- Better re-settlement for ex-offenders, inc. learning the lessons from Daedalus and working with local authorities to ensure that offenders housing needs are met
- More integrated offender management that ensures all needs are met e.g. mental health
- Developing employment opportunities for ex-offenders

REPARATION

- New types of sanctions e.g. Sobriety and better use of existing sanctions e.g. tagging
- Getting more from Community Payback
- Ensuring sentencing decisions fit the crime (sentencing unit, community impact statements)

- Budget settlement
- Policing model
- Strategic policing requirement
- Grants/commissioning
