

Further to your email requesting details of British Gas' commitments through the Energy Company Obligation (ECO) in London, please see below for more detail.


British Gas, with its London borough and housing association partners, has already committed to invest in excess of £36 million through eight schemes in London shown in the table below.

<b>Total</b>	<b>26278</b>

These schemes are expected to deliver measures to over 26,000 homes across London. In addition, British Gas is currently in discussions to potentially develop further ECO schemes in London and continues to work closely with London boroughs, housing associations and the GLA's RE:NEW team.
