It should be noted that the above offence codes are classified as "Non Notifiable to the Home Office".

This means that there is no legal requirement for Police to record their occurrence as there is for Notifiable offences (such as robbery or burglary).

Non Notifiable crimes are therefore under-represented on the CRIS database, however, this lack of recording does not mean that officers are less inclined to arrest and process offenders. Consequently counts of arrests for Non Notifiable Offences give a clearer picture of the volumes of these types of crime. (Not the case for Notifiable crimes).

The report covers Offences recorded between 01/01/2011 and 31/12/2015.

The Custody data was extracted from NSPIS Custody using the following parameters

- \* ALL Offence Titles and CJS Codes for ALL arrests dates in calendar years 2011 to 2015 inclusive
- \* Any Custody Record CJS code that started with "VG" was extracted. This indicated that it contained an offence under the Vagrancy Act of 1824
- \* Where there were multiple offences and/or disposals the first offence listed is shown with the disposals sorted to show charges first, then "cautions"
- \* Due to Central cell Allocation. The Borough is determined by the where the Custody Suite is that opened the Custody Record.  
To determine the exact location of the offence would require each offence to be examined and the location searched. Where matters are "No Further Action" etc. these details would not be shown.

A custody record is created upon the arrival of an arrested individual into a Police custody facility and therefore counts of Custody Records are synonymous with counting arrested individuals.
