Dear Chair.

Thank you for the letter sent on behalf of the London Assembly Economy Committee dated 10 October 2018. As stated in my email of 4 October 2018, it was a pleasure attending the Committee hearing and I thank you for taking the time to clarify the follow up information requested by the Committee.

I wanted to address each of the points as they appear in your letter:

(i) An estimate on how the staffing costs go alongside the community sports cost of £8.8 million

The staff posts being paid for out of the programme budget are 2 x Grade 8 (£43,517 p.a) and 0.5 x Grade 10 (£53,822 p.a). Including staff on-costs and a 2.5% annual salary increment, this equates to a total cost of approximately £449,000, or £149,000 p.a (5% of the entire programme budget).

(i) How the Habitat Programme will bring residents together, specifically how it is achieving the objectives of integration and ensuring people participate

The project Mr Dismore was referring to was 'Tottenham Silver Sports' and is being facilitated by Groundwork London. The programme will create activity hubs in Sheltered Housing Schemes in Tottenham bringing residents and non-residents together through sports in order to reduce isolation, improve health & happiness.

This programme will be guided by a steering group, with representation from older people, Haringey Council and activity providers, to ensure the programme of activity responds to participants wants and needs. The programme will address integration by offering; (i) local sports sessions with the opportunity for residents to engage and interact with tutors allowing them to build on physical and social confidence; (ii) one to one sessions and peer support for isolated residents, including personalised mobility plans and; (iii) sustainability and entrenching the change in communities through recruitment and training of project ambassadors, who will become effective advocates and create an ongoing peer support structure.

(ii) A list of people and groups who have been helped so far, with the amount of money that they receive and the length of time for which the funding is in place

Please refer to Appendix 1 for a full list of projects that have been supported to date.

(iii) A copy of the Impact Assessment.

As per my email of 4 October, I confirmed that we will be publishing an updated version of the Integrated Impact Assessment when we publish the final version of the Sport Strategy. For your reference, I have attached a copy of the draft Integrated Impact Assessment to this letter. All final documents will be provided to the Committee when the Sport Strategy has been published.
