
With over 70 acres of land, we have the opportunity to make a meaningful social, economic and environmental difference, locally and beyond.





This is a chance to address real issues and provide real solutions.



Leading the way in developing low carbon infrastructure.

Awarded £36 million from the Government's Green Heat Network Fund, OPDC is delivering a first-of-its-kind District Heat Network, using low-cost, low-carbon waste heat from data centres to heat existing and new homes, businesses and services in Old Oak.

This leading innovation will serve a major hospital, homes and businesses from as early as 2027, driving down energy bills and supporting future generations to live more sustainably.


Early activation and meanwhile use projects will align with OPDC's longer term regeneration and sustainability ambitions to create a legacy benefiting Old Oak.
