The London Assembly Health Committee investigation into HIV in London keeps people with lived experience of HIV and AIDS at its heart. The Committee felt it was vital to hear directly from those affected. Chair Krupesh Hirani AM was interested to speak with Ash Kotak, a long time advocate of raising awareness for those living with HIV.

This podcast is available in two parts. Part one highlights the importance of getting tested following a recent rise in HIV infections in London. It also discusses a vigil being held by Aids Memory UK for World AIDS Day.
