1. Role of Oversight Board

1.1. Deputy Mayor for Policing and Crime (DMPC) outlined Board's role.

2. Delivering the Police and Crime Plan

2.1. The DMPC stated her appreciation of the work that has gone in to the MPS Business Plan, and the drive to reflect the structure and priorities of the Police and Crime Plan. MPS advised that it is its assurance of how it will deliver the PCP; a one year document at this point. DMPC noted that it was a very well written, thought-out and useful plan. A number of issues were discussed

3. Performance Oversight

- 3.1. The latest performance indicators were reviewed. Key issues discussed included:
 - The March spike in recorded crime in London. It was noted that it had reduced in the following months.
 - Borough priorities and how that has embedded into performance management at the local level.
- 3.2. The DMPC noted that the turnaround in Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) checking had been excellent.
