1 Introduction and apologies

- 1.1 The Chair welcomed members to the inaugural meeting of the Advisory Group and led a round of introductions.
- 1.2 Apologies for absence were received from Simon Ashworth, Richard Clifton, Cllr Joe Dromey and Nichola Hay.

2 Declarations of Interest

2.1 There were no declarations of interest.

3 Terms of Reference

3.1 The Advisory Group received the terms of reference for the Group, which were approved by its parent body, the Skills for Londoners Board, in September 2018.

3.2 RESOLVED:

The terms of reference for the Outcomes for Londoners Advisory Group were noted.

4 Development of the approach to outcome-based commissioning model for the Adult Education Budget (AEB)

- 4.1 The Assistant Director, Skills and Employment, set out the proposed approach to developing an outcomes-based commissioning system, noting that this Group would be instrumental in shaping the model.
- 4.2 The ambition would be to develop a model that would measure not only educational and labour market outcomes, but also wider social outcomes.

4.3 RESOLVED:

The Advisory Group endorsed the proposed approach, as set out in the report, to support the work to inform the development of an outcomes-based commissioning model for the Adult Education Budget.

5 Skills for Londoners Framework Consultation responses – learnings on outcomes

5.1 The Group received a report setting out responses to the Skills for Londoners Framework Consultation in relation to outcomes-based commissioning. The key areas identified within the responses to the consultation were highlighted and Members were informed that feedback to the Framework was largely positive. It was

noted that respondents were largely from the public sector, from those delivering or with an interest in the AEB.

- 5.2 During the subsequent discussion, Members highlighted a range of considerations that should be taken into account when developing an outcomes-based model. These included: an understanding of approaches being considered in other areas, including international practice; the importance of involving both business and learner voice into the research; being mindful of changing skills needs and priorities; and giving consideration to the point at which outcomes are measured and the process of validation and reporting.
- 5.3 Officers reiterated that in developing the approach to outcomes-based commissioning, the priority was to develop a model that would work for adult education in London and any proposals to link payments to outcomes would be considered much later in the work and thoroughly tested to ensure they were appropriate and effective.

5.4 RESOLVED:

The Advisory Group noted the responses to, and the subsequent discussion on, the Skills for Londoners Framework consultation.

6 Outcomes Workshop

- 6.1 The remainder of the meeting took the form of a workshop. Members discussed the challenges the Group was trying to address and what it was aiming to achieve through outcomes-based commissioning.
- 6.2 The Group also considered potential outcome areas and how these might be prioritised. A range of potential outcome measures were suggested, and these would be considered further as the approach was developed. Members also discussed funding challenges and how this might affect an outcomes-based commissioning model.
- 6.3 The points raised during the discussion would be incorporated into the specification for the research consultancy work and circulated to the Group for comment before a consultant was procured.
- 6.4 A query was raised as to what the AEB currently pays for in London in terms of qualifications provided and at what level. Officers agreed to provide a high-level summary of this information outside of the meeting.

6.5 RESOLVED:

- (a) The workshop discussion was noted;
- (b) That a high-level summary of qualifications currently provided through the AEB in London, and at what level, would be provided to the Advisory Group; and
- (c) That the comments provided during the meeting would be incorporated into the specification for the research consultancy and circulated to the Advisory Group for comment.

1 Executive Summary

1.1 This report provides an overview of the work which has taken place on the development of an impact-based funding model for the Adult Education Budget (AEB) since the last Advisory Group meeting – and sets out the areas where officers would welcome input from members.

2 Recommendation

- 2.1 The Outcomes for Londoners Advisory Group is asked to:
 - 2.1.1 **Note** the update on the development of an impact-based funding model; and
 - 2.1.2 **Discuss** the questions raised at Issues for Consideration at Section 4 of this report.

3 Background

- 3.1 In February, following a competitive procurement process, City Hall appointed Learning and Work Institute (L&WI) to support the development of a draft set of robust outcome/impact definitions and measures that could be used to determine the success of provision delivered through the AEB.
- 3.2 The work conducted by L&WI to date includes:
 - A rapid review of approaches to outcomes measurements to identify relevant metrics, tools and approaches for consideration and lessons learnt from other examples of implementation, including key enablers and barriers;
 - Engagement with key political and policy leads, including Borough Leaders from the Sub-Regional Partnerships, and representatives of employers, which discussed the wider policy context and opportunities arising through the delegation of AEB;

- A series of stakeholder consultation workshops which explored the types of outcomes delivered through AEB-funded provision, challenges recognising and monitoring these outcomes and ways in which to develop the current system. These workshops brought representatives of AEB providers (including independent training providers, further education colleges and the voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) sectors), together with organisations from the wider stakeholder landscape.
- In-depth interviews with AEB providers to explore strengths and limitations of the current system, discuss alternative methods at recognising outcomes and identify the opportunities and methods by which to improve the current system;
- Focus groups with learners studying in AEB funded provision, which explored learner motivations for enrolling on courses; the impact learners believed study had had on them; and attitudes towards sharing information; and
- Development of a list of potential measures featuring a range of metrics and tools assessed against a range of relevant criteria informed by prior stages of the research.

4 Issues for Consideration

- 4.1 At the meeting, L&WI will present initial findings from the research (at Agenda Item 6), including the outcome measures which are considered most promising. The Advisory Group will be asked to provide a steer on:
 - How well the potential measures capture the impact of adult education in London;
 - Which of the potential measures are most important, from your perspective; and
 - Whether there are any gaps in the set of outcomes measures proposed.

5 Equality comments

5.1 This project will give due regard to diversity and inclusion with a focus on considering social as well as economic outcomes for Londoners. Social outcomes will be especially relevant to people who may be disadvantaged and therefore for whom employment is not a realistic or immediate outcome. This may include people with learning difficulties or disabilities, where English is not the first language, older people or people with very low skills. This outcomes work aims to ensure that the impact of learning is recognised for all Londoners who access provision funded by the delegated AEB.

6 Risks arising / mitigation

6.1 Key risks relate to gaining buy-in from providers to move towards an outcomes-based commissioning approach. The GLA has set up this Advisory Group to mitigate this risk by ensuring that providers are involved in the

development of the approach to future commissioning from the outset. Further engagement activity is planned throughout the project period.
