

## Our aim: Disproportionality



#### High rate of exclusions



Serious youth violence - disproportionality

Good schools, but high variance

Compounded lack of investment - mental health services, SLT, GPs, adults and children








- Culture had to be right to start pilot positive relationships with police are central to this work
- Founded on trust, commitment and willingness to work together between senior leaders in North Area Unit and Children's Services in Haringey.
- 'Working together' is at the core of our child protection activity.
- This work has purposefully sought to place aside historical narratives on police use of stop and search, instead working together on the common purpose of keeping children and young people safe.
- Mutual respect recognising the importance of stop and search, and any follow up activity, being conducted in a way that is respectful of the individuals affected; legitimacy is key to confidence in policing and local authority safeguarding procedures.
- We work under the HSCP Safeguarding is everyone's business and therefore any
  interaction with a child or a young person should be reflected on strategically by police, for
  opportunities to protect children and young people across all agencies.
- Going beyond culture and ethnicity fostering a sense of belonging for children







- Phase 1 using data intelligently to inform the business case and solve the safeguarding 'problem'
- Negotiating a specific data sharing agreement to access sensitive police information
- Using information from other agencies to deepen understanding of contextual factors, for example:
  - a) YJB focus on length of times for National Referral Mechanism disparity in delays
  - b) Pre MACE intelligence
  - c) Black & Global Majority inclusion

# Findings from Audits February 2022 – March 2023





Sample Stop and search *records* from February 2022 – March 2023

*Volume* estimated 7,484 total stop and searched conducted. 1,561 assessed as children under 18 years old.

**91** stop and search records were analysed by those involved in the pilot over the period February 2022 – March 2023

6 stop and search records had no MERLIN report, and the children were not Haringey residents, but children stopped in 'Haringey hot spot areas'. These were removed from the sample

**8** stop and search records had a linked MERLIN created after the stop and search

# Findings



System issues from audits

- 3 Children in care to Haringey LA not informed
- 14 of the children lived in households where DA was an issue with 2 children reporting avoiding staying at home due to parental conflict and DA not previously reported. Of the 14, 3 previously known to MARAC
- 6 children under the age of 15, resident in another LA but stopped and search in Haringey. 2 found in possession of cannabis and at risk of exploitation 1 was a looked after child
- 16 experienced significant housing instability, temporary accommodation and cross borough mobility
- 4 known to Education Welfare and a concern for Children Missing Education
- 2 Children whose parents worked for the Council and the police
- 2 Children, 16plus using the names of older adult siblings or declined to disclose ID
- Children and young people also known to Haringey Learning Partnership, Special Schools, diagnosis of autism, diabetes, epilepsy and other primary and secondary health care leads & SEND not notified



17 stop and searches not linked to a merlin – shot , stabbed and later died on 15/04/2023 in Tottenham.

- Mother Childminder , HMI involved
- Mother destroyed smart whip capsules & referred to GP who not appreciating the issues did not refer
- Post death community intelligence suggested
   – family home would be robbed to recover a debt
- T known to Youth service, but police youth link officer not notified of penalty notices
- Educational establishment not notified.







Advance to Phase 3:

- Pilot work with the MET police to extend to all BCU's in London to audit 10 stop & search with no linked merlin for children under 16 years old
- Feed the findings into the consultation for working together
- Focused work with SEN Schools, Neighbourhood Police & SEND

- Through CDOP & Safeguarding Partnerships Boards use data to examine system for Preventing child deaths.
- Information sharing for identified cohorts: adolescents on CP, Pre MACE, YJS, Rapid Reviews,

# HARINGEY CONTINUE – IMPLEMENTATION OF PRACTICE CHANGES



- Young People
- The Missing App Go Wisely
- Parenting Education
- Development of Parent Champions trained to lead Family Network meeting for children absent or missing from home
- Child IDVA's
- School exclusion/use of reduced timetables
- Stop and search data shared at Pre Mace
- SLT needs and perceptions of behaviour and use of force

## **Stories from children**



C, aged 14, stopped and search 7 times, he was 13 the first time he was stopped and searched. C described feeling ashamed so did not disclose these instances to his new Social Worker, mentor or carer. C avoided spending time in the areas he was stopped and searched impacting school attendance and peer relationships. Recently, C was robbed but his lack of trust in the Police prevented police disclosure.



### **Stories from the workforce**

 We are senior officers within the Council, who experienced being stopped and search as a child referred to as: IC3 male. Decades later we recall the humiliation and trauma because of the *way* the stop and search was conducted. Complaints: we never received a response.







#### **Stories from parents / carers**

My son was killed by another young person near my home , his body laid on a dirty pavement ... I wanted the police to stop and search all children until I spoke to my sons, friends and those at his school. I then pleaded for a change so more young people would develop trust and reduce the perception of over policing, under protected.
