

Why we need a New Deal for Young People



Young people are the future of our city.



But many young people from disadvantaged backgrounds are not sure about their future.



Young people from disadvantaged backgrounds have been more badly affected by things like:

• Covid-19.



• The cost of living crisis - this is when the prices of the things we need to live are going up a lot.



Young people in London do not all have a fair chance to do their best.



We want to help young people from disadvantaged backgrounds to have a better chance to do their best.



That is why we have created our New Deal for Young People.



It will give 100,000 young people from disadvantaged backgrounds the chance to get more support for their future.

What we are doing to support London's young people



The New Deal for Young People aims to make London fairer and a place where no one is left behind.

What we want

We want:



• 100,000 young Londoners from disadvantaged backgrounds to get really good **mentoring**.

Mentoring is when someone you trust gives you advice, guidance and support about how to do something.



 All young Londoners to have good activities to do in their local area.



We also want to have more good mentoring and activities for young people in London.

What we will do



We will:

 Make mentoring better for young people.



 Give more money for mentoring and activities for young people in London.



 Allow staff who work with young people to improve the way they work.



So far, 75,000 young Londoners have had some mentoring.



This has been paid for by the Mayor of London.




