- 1. From 3 June to 19 July 2024 any person may inspect the accounts for MOPAC for the year ended 31 March 2023 on the MOPAC website https://www.london.gov.uk/what-we-do/mayors-office-policing-and-crime-mopac/about-mayors-office-policing-and-crime-mopac/our-finances
- 2. On reasonable notice they may request access to certain related documents (comprising books, deeds, contracts, bills, vouchers and receipts). Application should be made initially at the e-mail address FINMailbox-.HQFinancialAccountingClientCorrespondence@met.police.uk
- 3. During the period 3 June to 19 July 2024 a local government elector for the area of MOPAC, or his/her representative, may ask the auditor questions about the accounts. Please contact the auditor at the address given above to make arrangements to ask any questions.
- 4. During the period 3 June to 19 July 2024 a local government elector for the area of MOPAC, or his/her representative, may object to MOPAC's accounts asking that the auditor issue a report in the public interest and/or apply to the court for a declaration that an item in the accounts is contrary to law (under section 28 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014). Written notice of a proposed objection and the grounds on which it is made must be sent to the auditor at the address given above and copied to me at the address given below.
