1: Welcome and minutes and actions from previous meeting (06/06/24)

The Board was welcomed to the meeting. The minutes of the last meeting were agreed. All actions have been completed or are in progress.

2: Prison Early Release Scheme (SDS40)

The Board was provided with an overview of Standard Determinate Sentence, 40% (SDS40) which will be implemented on 10/09/24 to mitigate prison overcrowding and enable the sustainable management of prison capacity.

3: MPS Updates

The Board was advised that Operation Soteria has been invaluable in transforming services for rape victims. The MPS has made positive improvements in their services; charge rates in rape investigations have increased in recent years, the MPS works with the CPS to attain early charging advice, the MPS has a joint action plan with HMCTS to increase the charges which are successfully convicted at court, and victims are supported during the charging and court processes.

4: VAWG Board Outcomes Framework: Improving Prevention of VAWG

NHS: The Board received an overview of the work and outcomes of the Stalking Threat Assessment Centre.

VRU: The Board received an overview of VRU VAWG programmes and the positive outcomes they have achieved.
