The actions from the last meeting were circulated and MOPAC Head of Partnerships went through the outstanding actions.

<u>Item 2.1 MPS Criminal Justice Performance</u> <u>a) Case File Quality Improvement Plans</u>

The MPS presented the paper circulated to the board on MPS Criminal Justice Performance which included the impact of the CJ Strategic Action Plan & the CJ Tactical Plan to improve MPS performance in the criminal justice arena and case file quality. Data up until the end of March shows that the MPS' case file compliance has increased 5% in the last quarter.

b) Westminster DA Charging Pilot update

The MPS presented the paper circulated to the board on the status of the joint MPS and CPS DA Initiative at Central West BCU which is currently being evaluated. The MPS and CPS are to meet and discuss the findings and consider the next steps for the project.

Item 2.2 London Crown Court Performance and Delivery Board (LCCPDB)

HMCTS presented the paper circulated to the board on Crown Court Performance for FY 23/24, Objectives for 2024-25 and work ongoing to underpin these through the London Crown Court Performance and Delivery Board, including how partner agencies can contribute to reducing ineffective trial rates.

Item 3. HMPPS London Prisons Capacity and Probation Reset

HMPPS updated that London CJ partners are now meeting weekly to discuss prison capacity on an operational level. HMPPS London Probation provided a verbal briefing on the Probation Reset Implementation and key milestones, confirming that a written update would be shared with the board and partners locally.

<u>Item 4. MoJ GPS Tagging Scheme</u>

The MPS presented on the paper MoJ GPS Tagging Scheme circulated to the board, concerning multi agency challenges relating to the management of offenders subject to electronic monitoring orders. The MoJ EM team and HMCTS described the learning from these challenges. It was agreed that there will be ongoing scrutiny of this issue at the CJS Effectiveness Board.

Item 5. AOB

The DMPC raised that serious violence, homicide and robbery are key priorities for the Mayor and that every partner has a role to play in reducing these crimes, noting that MOPAC held the first Robbery Reduction Partnership meeting on 20th of May with the second meeting on the 12th June.
