Project Description:

The project supports ethnic minority groups, mothers, young people, and people seeking asylum in London. It addresses educational barriers and challenges negative attitudes towards learning, especially in numeracy and literacy. The project delivers tailored outreach activities, promotes adult skills opportunities, and builds relationships with skills providers to create referral pathways. It hosts workshops, events, and one-on-one support sessions to identify individual needs and create tailored action plans.

Project Description:

This project works with French-speaking Black African women in South London who are seeking asylum. It addresses barriers to developing basic English, numeracy, and vocational skills because of their cultural backgrounds and life experiences. The project engages women through outreach, promotion, workshops, and one-to-one support. It refers participants into adult learning providers and supports them in gaining qualifications. This initiative helps improve their chances of employment, which in turn enhances their incomes and living standards for them and their families.

4. Art4Space: “Creative Pathways to Employment and Training”

Project Description:

Creative Pathways uses art and creativity to connect adults with further learning by providing a welcoming space for exploration and conversation for those hesitant about formal education. These sessions encourage participants to pursue their educational goals. The project delivers interactive sessions across Lambeth, collaborating with London Adult Learning Service providers to identify engagement gaps within specific groups and design targeted outreach and support for demographics most in need.

5. Belina Grow CIC: “Belina Grow BRIDGE 2024-25”

Project Description:

The Grow Programme engages women across four London boroughs: Croydon, Hillingdon, Kingston, and Newham. It focuses on mothers with low or no qualifications, qualifications from other countries, those with English as a second language, and those from ethnic minority communities. The project will engage with participants through group sessions and provide a personal adviser, access to the Grow app, and a weekly newsletter. It will then refer participants to adult education opportunities, including courses to improve their numeracy skills and London Multiply.

The project collaborates with local colleges, Adult Learning Skills services, and London Multiply providers.

Project Description:

The “Pathway 2 Education” project engages communities facing multiple barriers, particularly those from Black, Asian, and other minority ethnic backgrounds, through community outreach and engagement sessions. It connects people with skills and language barriers to adult education opportunities via a single point of entry. A bilingual outreach worker engages participants through local schools, food banks, mosques, and community organisations. The project offers taster courses and strengthens partnerships with mainstream educational providers, such as Barnet and Southgate College, to map out progression routes for individuals that enrol in their programme.
