1: Welcome and minutes and actions from previous meeting (05/09/24)

The Board was welcomed to the meeting. The minutes of the last meeting were agreed. All actions have been completed or are in progress.

2: Mayor's VAWG Strategy Refresh

The Board was advised that a draft Police and Crime Plan (PCP) will be published shortly and there will be an eight-week consultation period. The Board was provided with an overview of the priorities and commitments of the current VAWG Strategy. The Board provided feedback on how partnership working can support delivery of the VAWG Strategy and the role of the VAWG Board in implementing the Strategy.

3: VAWG Board Outcomes Framework: Improving Trust and Confidence in the Criminal Justice System

CPS: The Board was advised that rape cases are regularly reviewed, counsels are briefed, and RASSO prosecutors are trained, to identify and address any arising assumptions and misconceptions. Equally Ours was commissioned to research the language of assumptions and misconceptions; this has informed guidance for prosecutors and other victim-facing roles.

London Probation: The Board was advised that a risk assessment and safeguarding checks are conducted for each offender. Staff are trained on the role Probation plays in different types of civil proceedings; Probation is working with partners to improve information sharing and notifications of orders.

MPS: The Board was advised that there are multiple cross-cutting issues influencing public trust and confidence. Data on victim satisfaction is reviewed to consider the factors influencing different demographics.

4: MPS Updates

The Board was advised that the MPS is analysing the results of the Operation Soteria Bluestone Victim Experience Survey. The MPS work to improve support to RASSO victims includes a Transformation Plan and a Sexual Violence Reference.

5: Any Other Business

The MOPAC VAWG Team circulated a report providing an update on MOPAC programmes.
