- 2. On reasonable notice they may request access to certain related documents (comprising books, deeds, contracts, bills, vouchers and receipts). Application should be made initially at the e-mail address FINMailbox-HQFinancialAccountingClientCorrespondence@met.police.uk
- 3. During the period 3 July to 13 August 2025 a local government elector for the area of MOPAC, or his/her representative, may ask the auditor questions about the accounts. Please contact the auditor at the address given above to make arrangements to ask any questions.
- 4. During the period 3 July to 13 August 2025 a local government elector for the area of MOPAC, or his/her representative, may object to MOPAC's accounts asking that the auditor issue a report in the public interest and/or apply to the court for a declaration that an item in the accounts is contrary to law (under section 28 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014). Written notice of a proposed objection and the grounds on which it is made must be sent to the auditor at the address given above and copied to me at the address given below.
