Methodology



This survey was carried out by YouGov for the GLA between 17th Oct to 3rd Nov 2025, with a response of 1,416 London residents aged 18+.



The figures have been weighted to be representative of all London adults.



Respondents completed the surveys online from an email link.




Data is analysed by parents of children aged 0 to 16, gender, age, ethnicity, social grade, home ownership, disability, and inner/outer London. Where these are not mentioned there are no significant differences.

Summary

- Four in ten Londoners (41%) consider the city to be a suitable place to raise children.
- When choosing a place to raise children, Londoners are most likely to consider schools (52%), crime and safety (41%) and proximity to family and social networks (31%).
- Four in ten Londoners aged between 18 and 50 who don't have children (39%) say they **plan to have children** in future. The most common reason, amongst those who do not plan to have children, is that they **don't want them** (59%).
- Three quarters of current London parents (73%) expect to **continue raising their children here**, compared to 55% of those who plan to have **children in the future**.

Four in ten Londoners (41%) as well as parents (40%) think that London is a **suitable place to raise children**.



Schools, crime and safety, and nearby family and social networks are the most common important factors for both Londoners generally and current parents when deciding where to raise children.

Important factors when deciding where to raise children (%, up to three choices)



Demographics

- Schools are more likely to be considered an important factor by those aged 65 and over, White Londoners, homeowners, and outer Londoners.
- Crime and safety is a higher priority among Asian Londoners, those currently living with family and friends, and outer Londoners, as well as current parents of children aged 0 to 16.
- Being close to family and social networks is more likely to be a priority for women, those aged 25 to 49, ABC1 Londoners, those without disabilities, homeowners, as well as parents of children aged 0 to 16.



Four in ten Londoners aged between 18 and 50 who don't currently have children (39%) plan to have them in the future. The most common reason for not having them, among those who do not plan to, is that they don't want them (59%).


Plans to have children in future




Over half of Londoners who plan to have children in future (55%) say that they would **want to raise them in London**. Of London parents currently raising children, three quarters (73%) plan to **continue raising them here**.

Whether would raise future children in London


(% of non-parents aged 18 to 50 planning to have children)
