

I am most concerned that you have proposed unisex toilets. I believe that this will put women at unnecessary risk of inappropriate attention from men, when women should feel safe surrounded by only other women. Have you considered that (especially) late at night when toilets are very quiet a lone woman would feel very vulnerable and probably quite fearful if an unknown man/men suddenly arrived in what should be a women only convenience? It also puts men at risk of false/mistaken allegations.

What is wrong with women only/men only toilets, which have served us well until now? If you MUST have a unisex toilet this should in addition to the traditional, NOT as an only option. I for one would NEVER enter a unisex toilet no matter how desperate and that would put my health at risk. It appears to me that there could be an anti-women agenda working here as we are the ones mostly at risk - I hope that is NOT so? Our safety and privacy it seems are being sacrificed on the alter of political agenda.
