Policy H1

We strongly oppose the proposed 60% increase in Havering's Housing targets. We live in the south of the borough where plans have been passed for the building of 2900 units, including railway station, school, medical centre [so we have been told] with inadequate parking places planned before the site has been started. We will have local parking zones in the road we live because the shortage of places in the new development - we think this is destroying our quality of life.

We are now under further pressure from the Mayor's office to build even more - not content with the huge amount of housing already in the pipeline. We were promised over the years a lot of this land, which is already industrial, would be upgraded and increased to give local people more jobs. Instead we are under threat for even less jobs and more housing with no mention of another A & E Hospital. Our local hospital, Queen's in Romford is hugely overstretched now without thousands of more people coming into the area. The A13 is already gridlocked, reported on BBC road watch nearly every morning, how is this going to work with hundreds of more cars coming into our area. This theory that people will use the station, and forsake having a car is utter nonsense.
