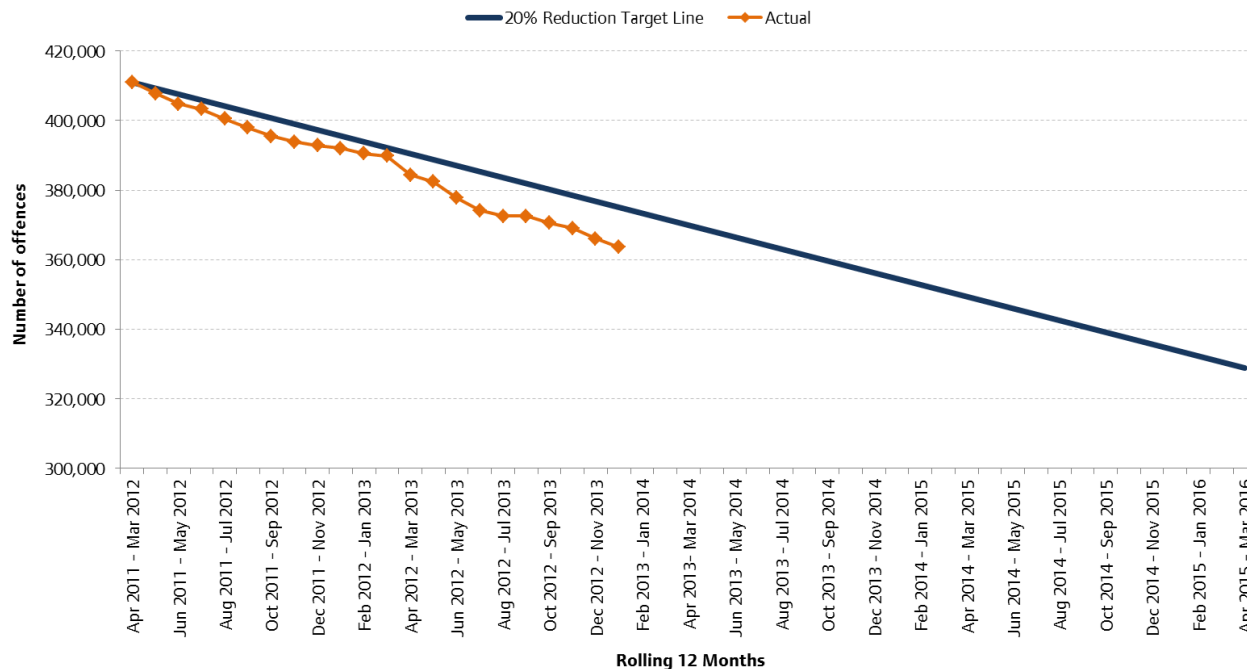

*MOPAC's challenge to the Metropolitan Police Service over the next four years is to cut seven key neighbourhood crimes by 20%.*

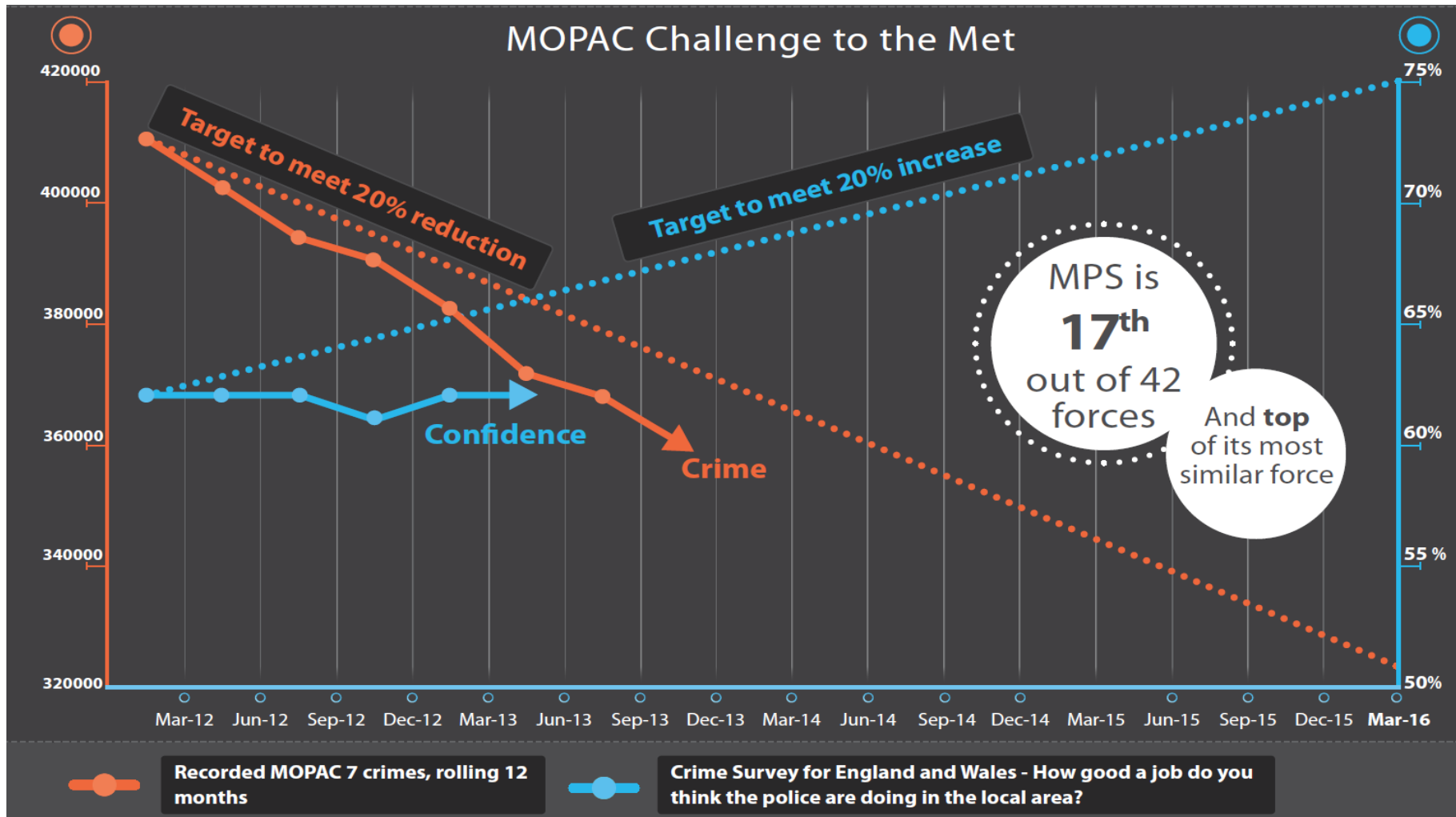

The MPS is currently on track to achieve the target.

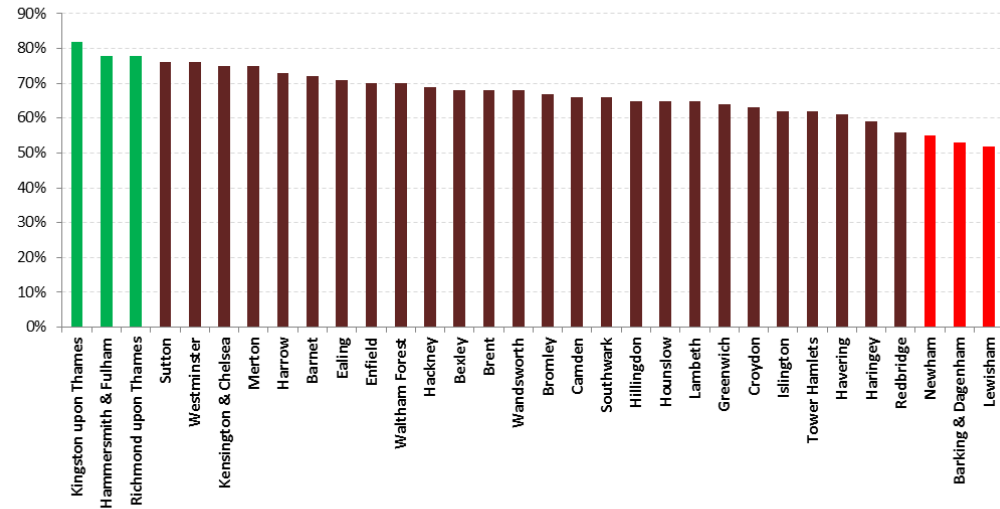

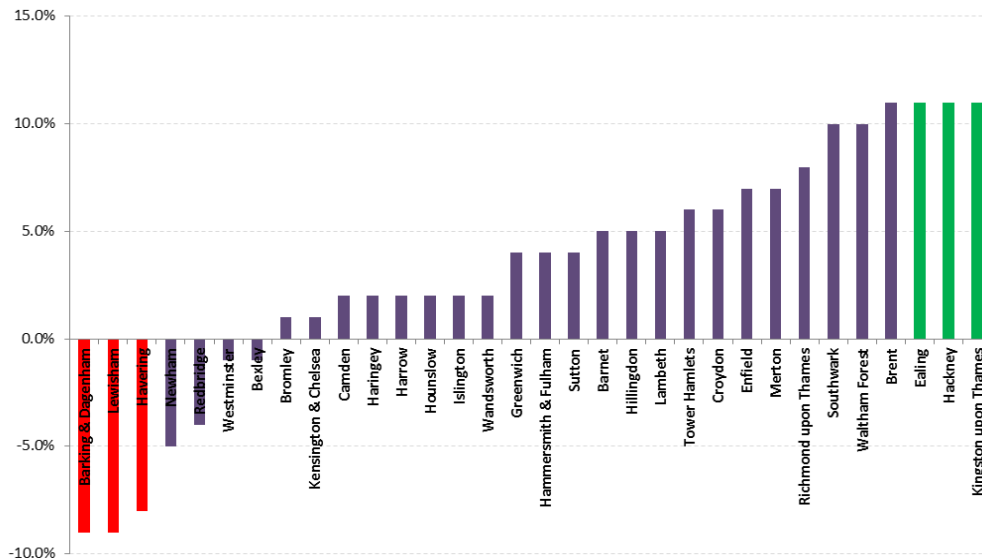
# CONFIDENCE IN THE MPS

PAS - Confidence measure Point change from previous rolling year

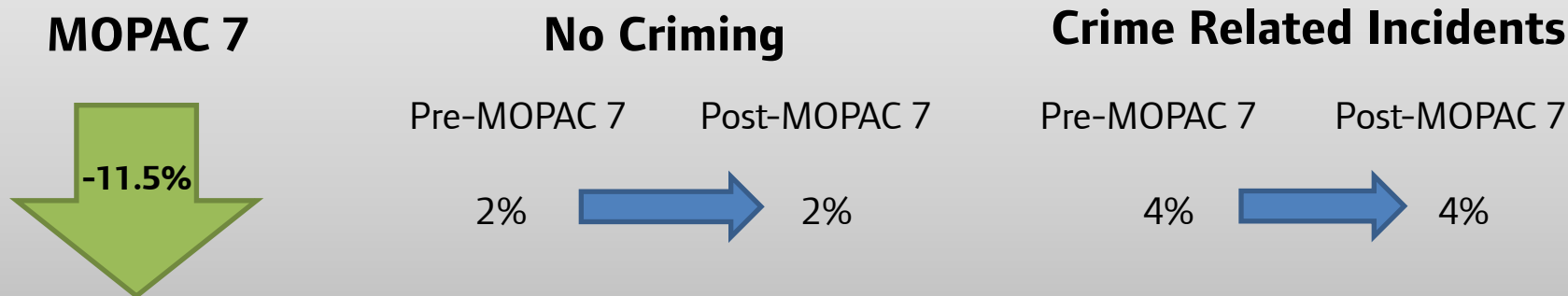

# CJ Timeliness – key issues

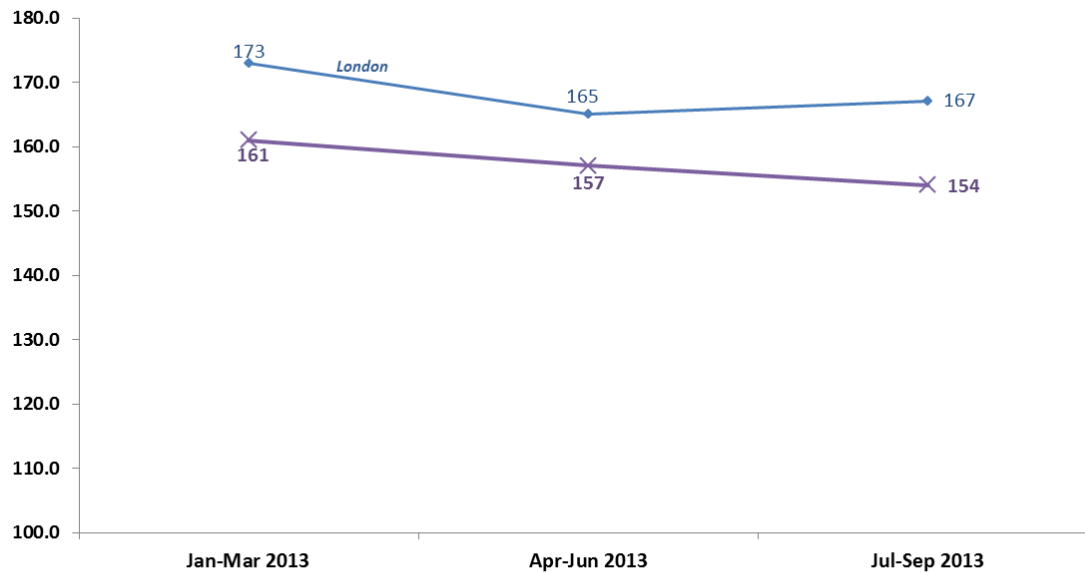
- The overall figures for timeliness of cases going through courts in London has not changed significantly, but when we focus on criminal cases, we can see timeliness is improving.
- There is a variation in workload and timeliness across court areas in London.
- Trial effectiveness has improved in Q2 2013/14. Crown Court Effective trial rate for Year to date is the second best in the country breaking through 60%.

# CJ Timeliness

- Magistrates' courts are now grouped in Local Justice Areas and MOJ does not provide court level data.
- Generally the courts do not have the same responsibilities so they are directly comparable in terms of timeliness. Some courts deal with Traffic cases and some deal with other criminal cases. For example in East London LJA, all first hearing cases are heard at Thames Magistrates' court and then transferred to Stratford Magistrates' court.
- Each court house has a different capacity, so there is inevitably a difference in workload between courts.
- The courts also have a different type of crime mix and volume.

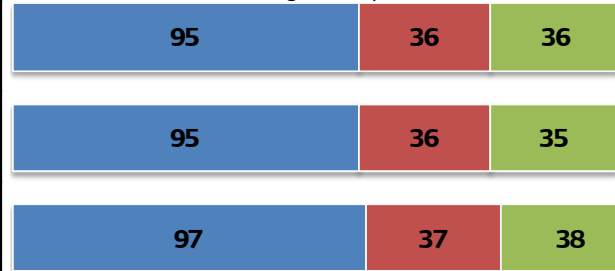

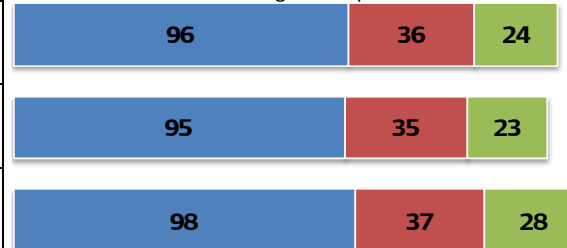

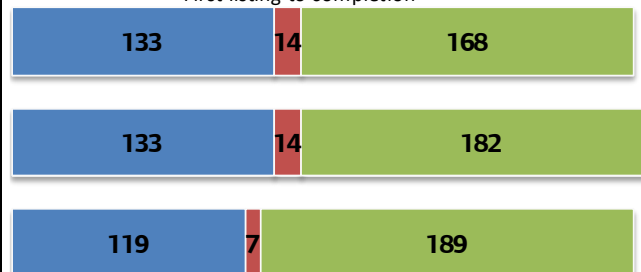

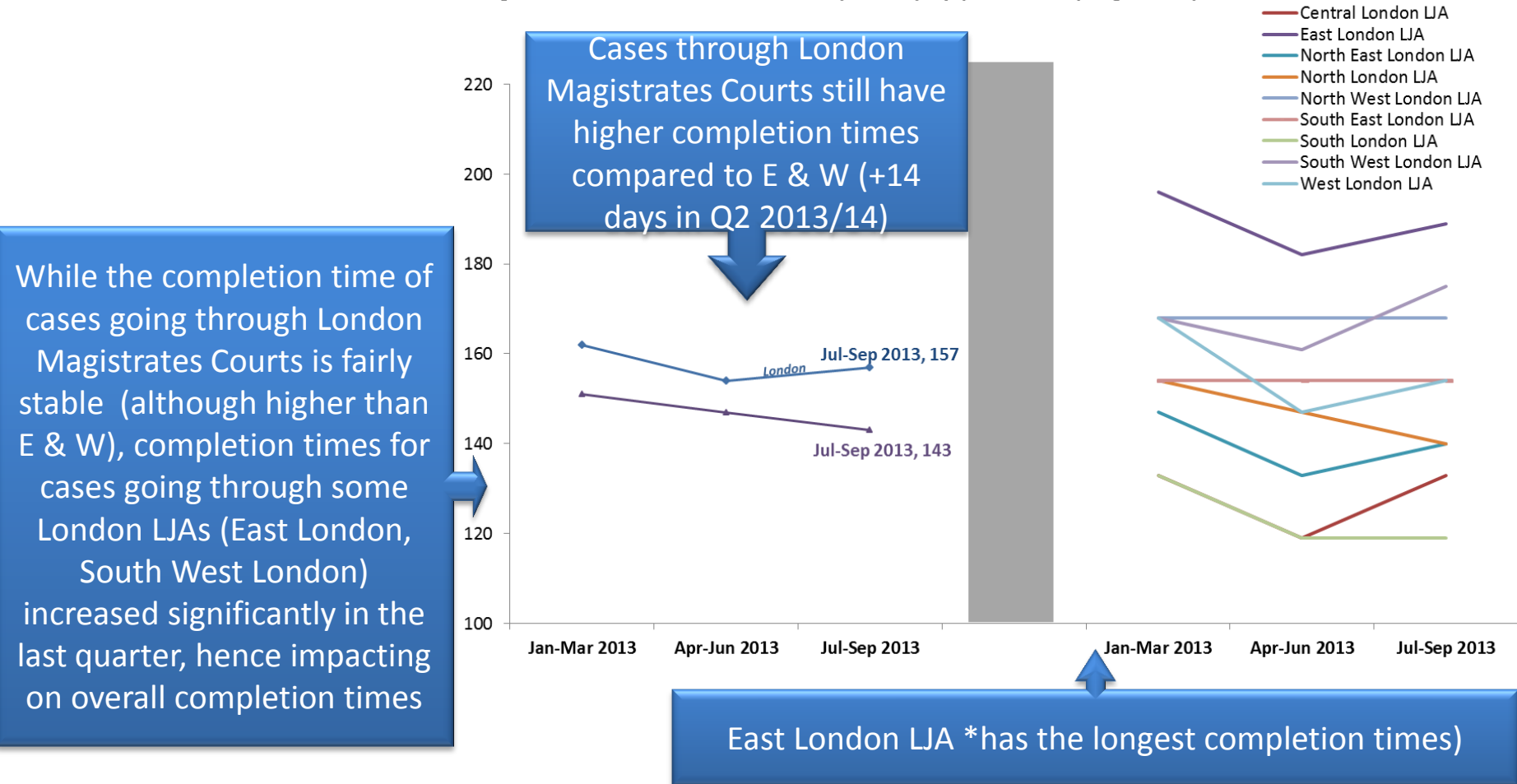

How is the performance of cases going through magistrates' courts affecting the overall completion times?

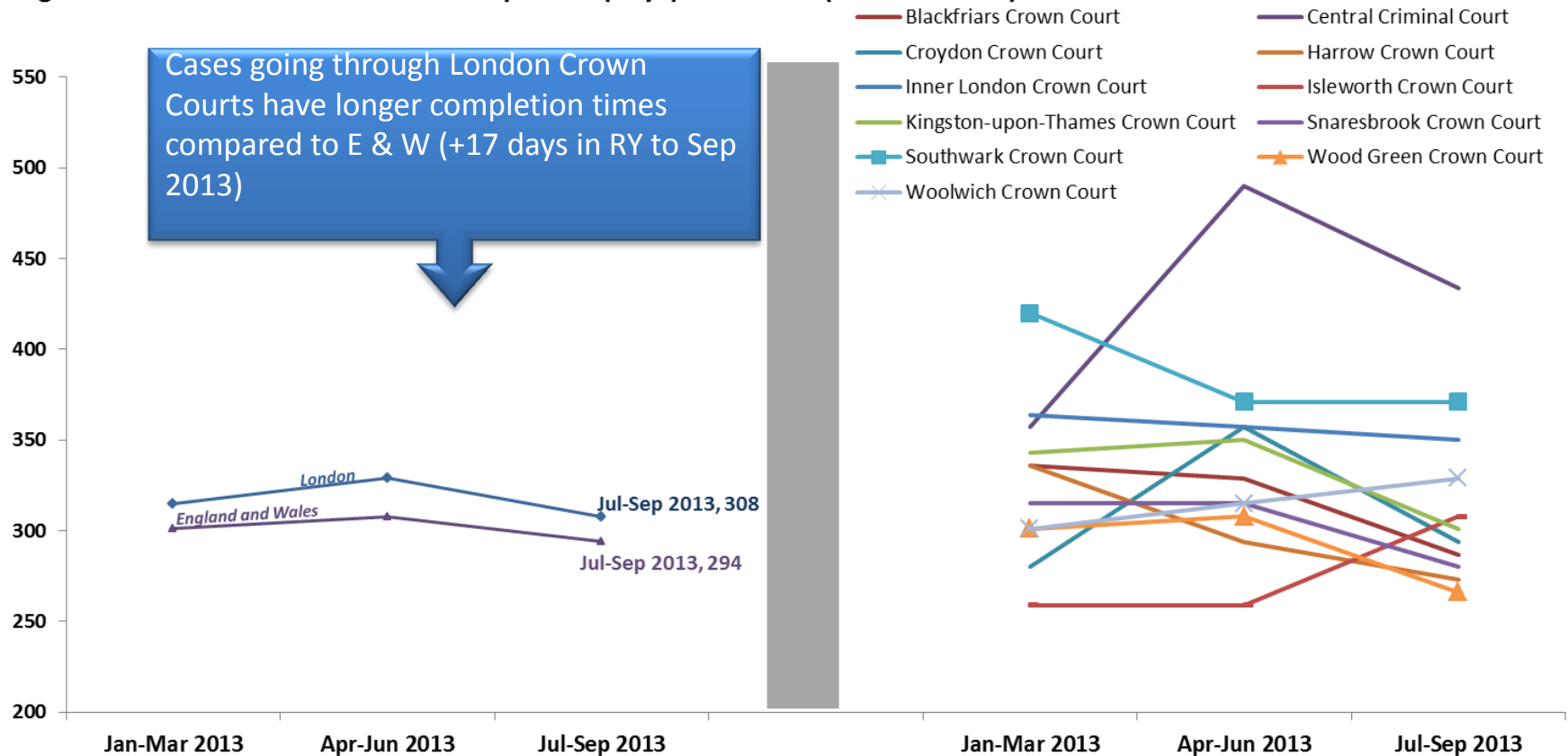
Average time from offence to overall completion (days) in London (Magistrates)



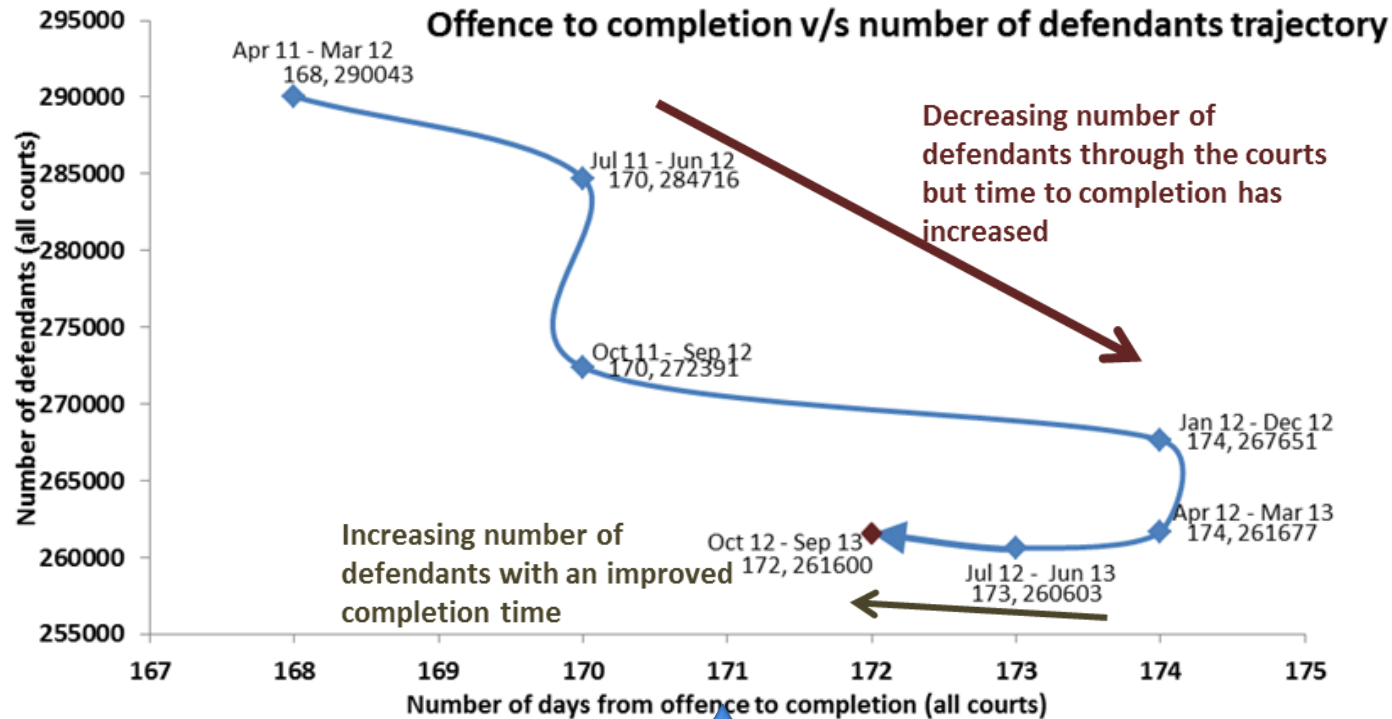

# CJ timeliness– Offence to Completion (all courts)



Since FY 2011/12, the number of defendants in court has been decreasing but until FY 12/13, the offence to completion period has been increasing too which may be due to a number of reasons such as increasing case complexity, issues with the process or local problems in particular areas... Since July 2012 – June 2013, as the number of defendants increased, the completion time was reduced.

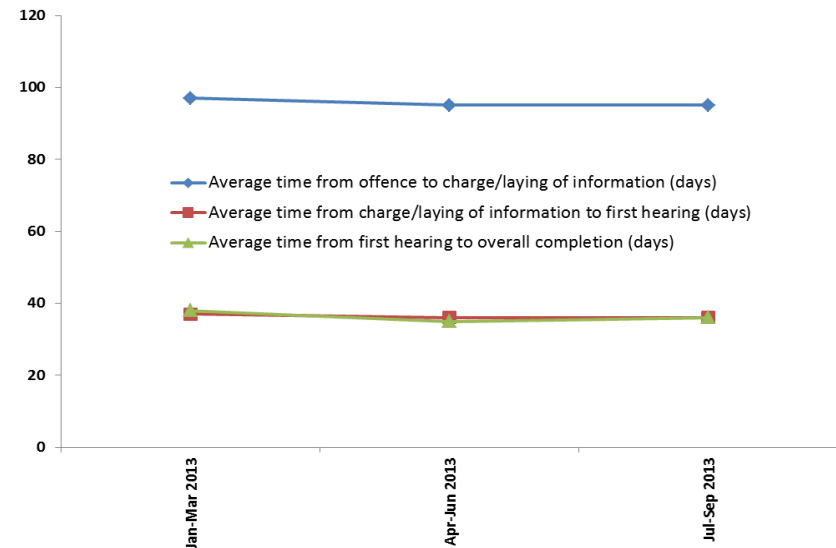

# CJ timeliness– delay drivers (all courts)

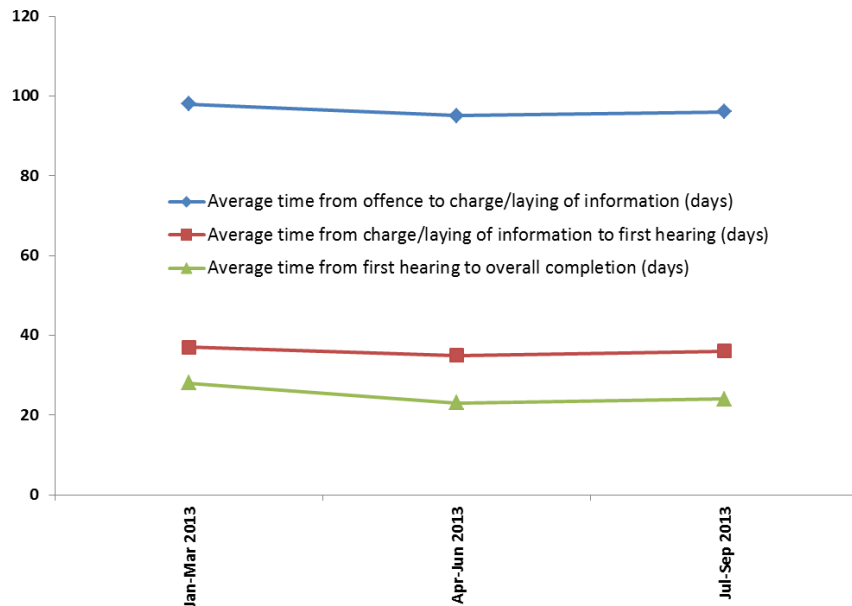
The “offence to charge” delay driver accounts for 53% - 56% of the overall offence to completion period.

This is slightly higher for cases being dealt within the Magistrate Courts (58% - 61%) compared to Crown Courts (34% - 43%)

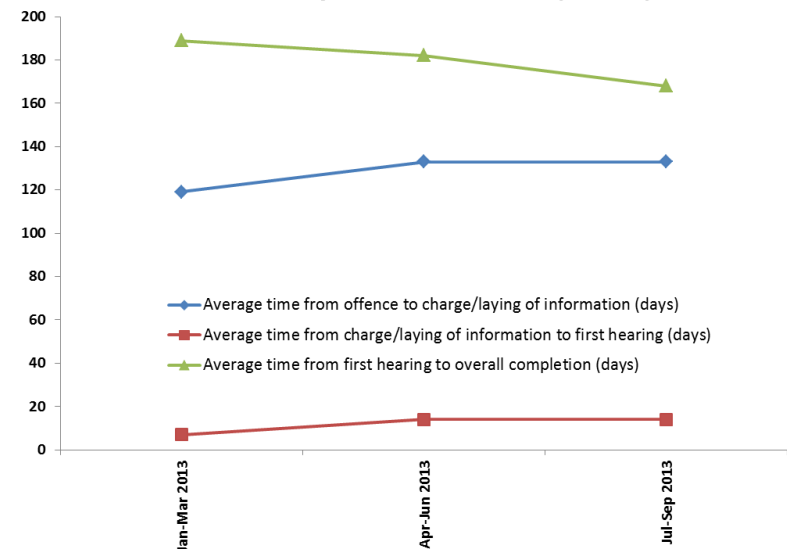
Trend in Delay drivers in London (all courts)



Trend in Delay drivers in London (Magistrates)

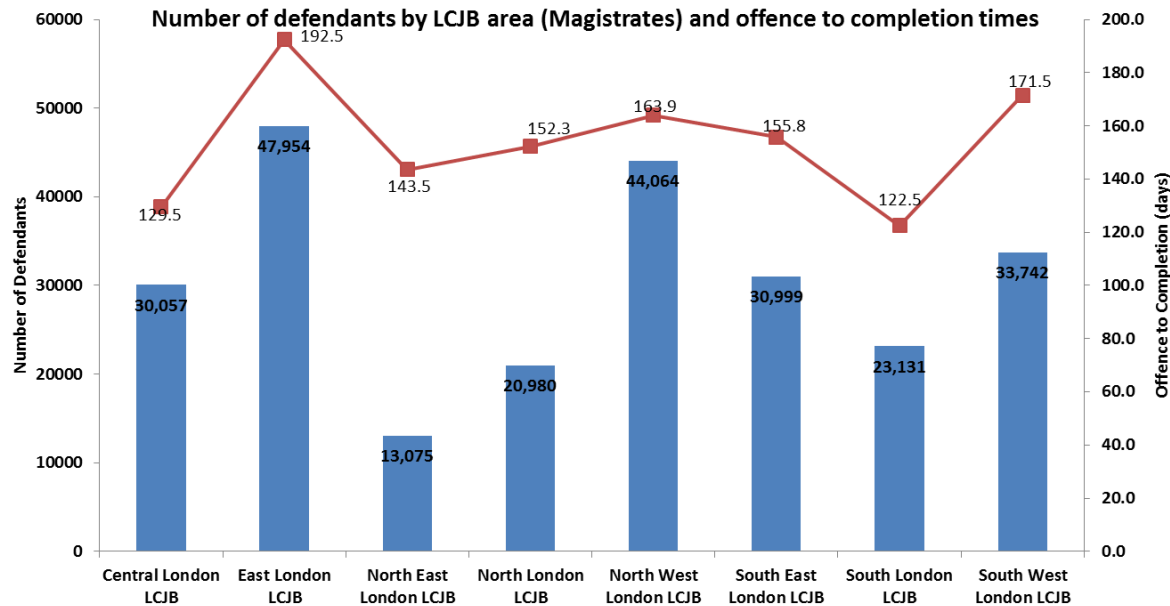


Trend in Delay drivers in London (Crown)

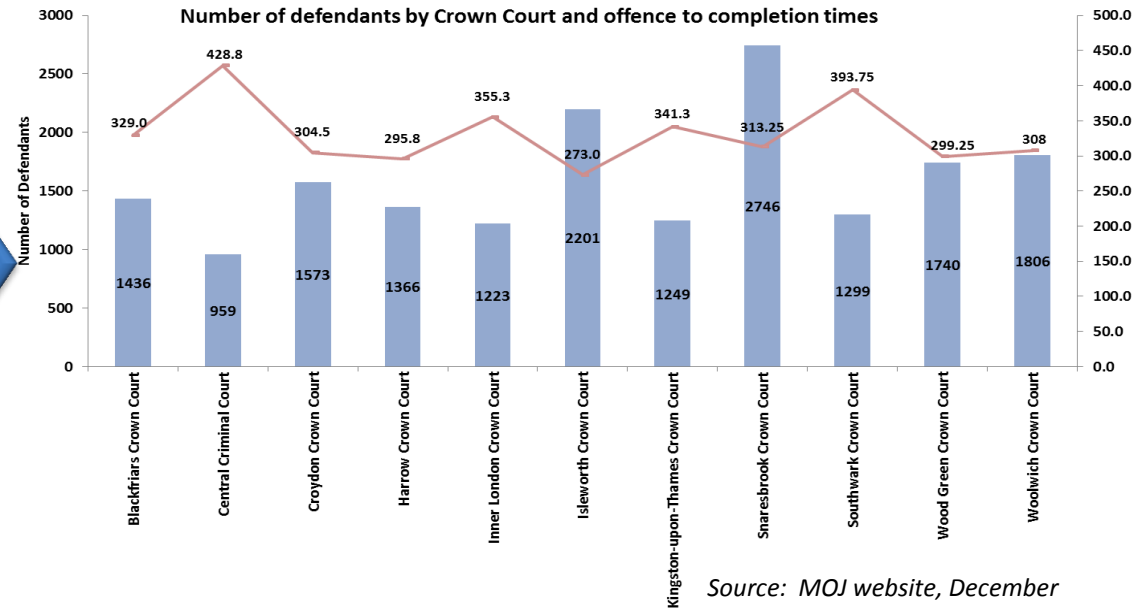

# CJ timeliness– Number of defendants v/s completion time in October 2012 to September 2013 (Crown)

Central Criminal Court has the highest completion times although it has the lowest number of defendants. This may be due to the complexity of cases being dealt by this court. Isleworth Crown Court has the highest percentage increase in Jul – Sep 2013 compared to the previous quarter (+18.9%).

The period from Offence to arrest changes considerably when cold cases (more than 10 years old) are removed. 62.5% reduction in offence to arrest time (from 96 to 36 days) in Q3 2013/14.

This may be an indication of improved public confidence to report old crimes to police.

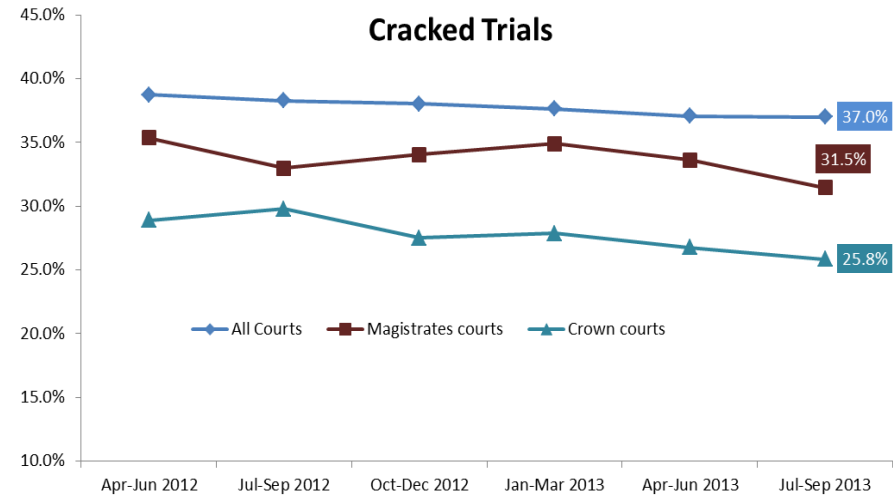

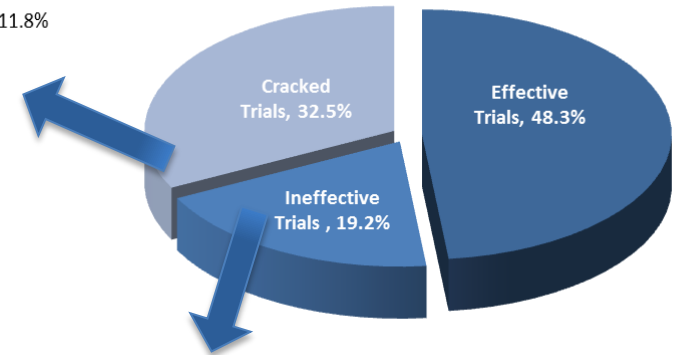
Improvement in trial effectiveness in Q2 2013/14.



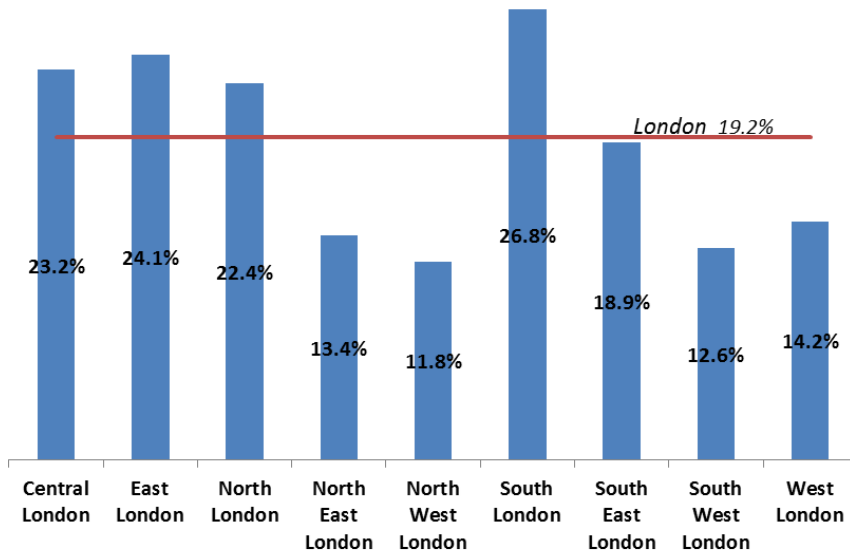
# Trial Effectiveness – Magistrates (April -September 2013)



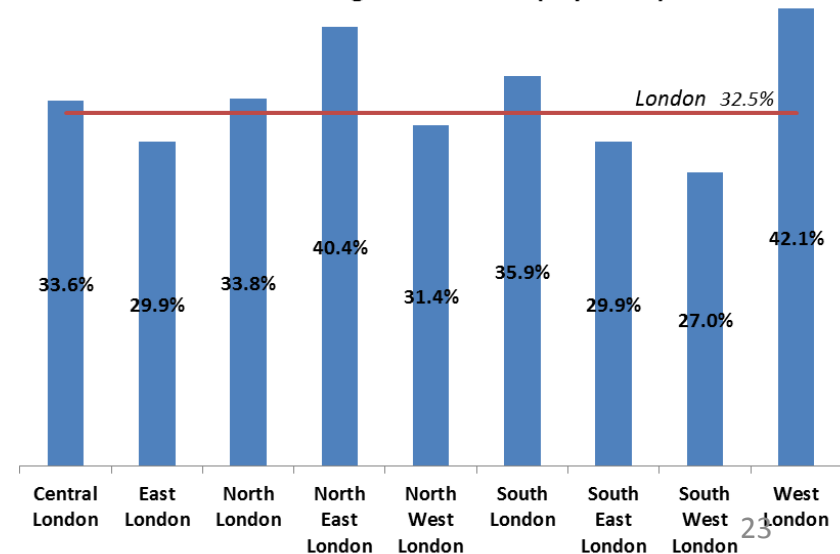
**Effectiveness of Trials - Magistrate Courts**



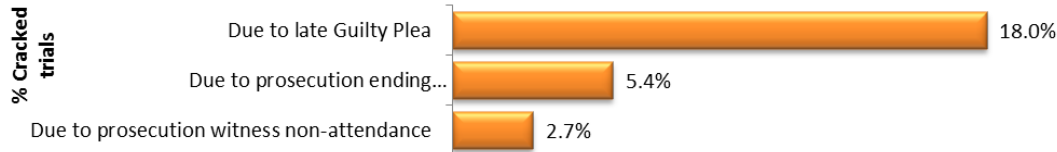

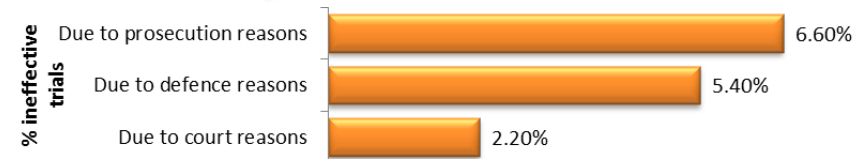

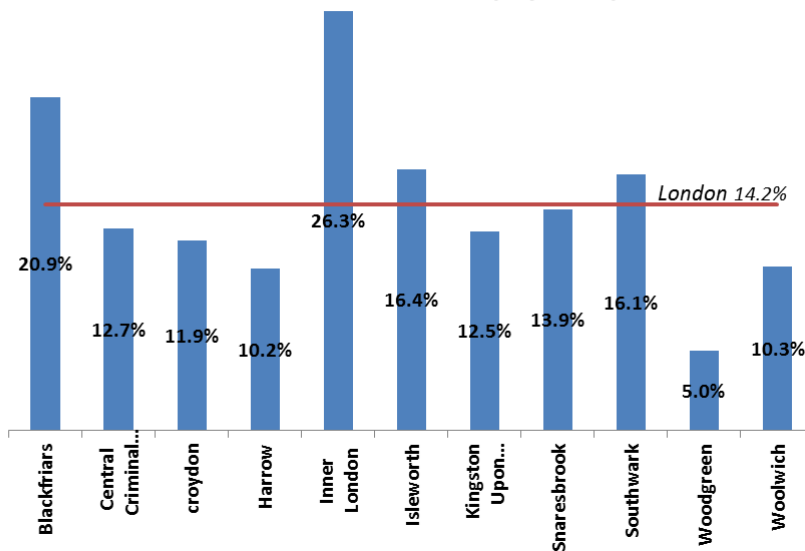

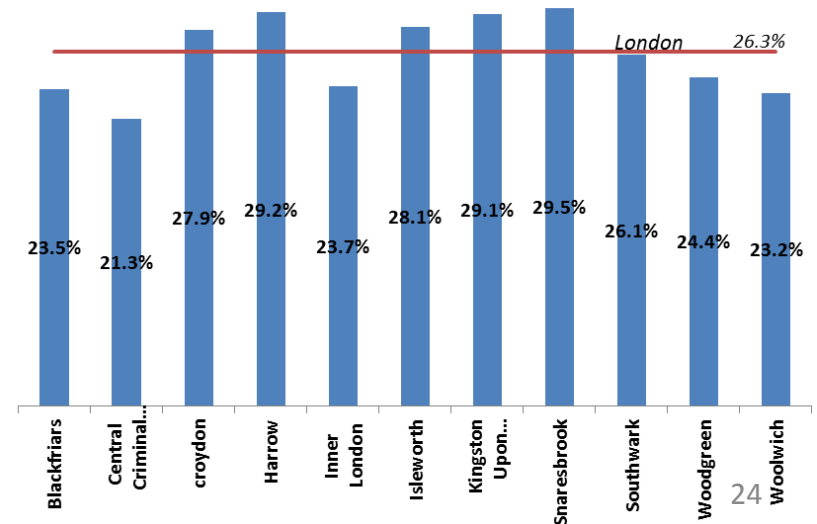
**Effectiveness of Trials - Crown Courts**

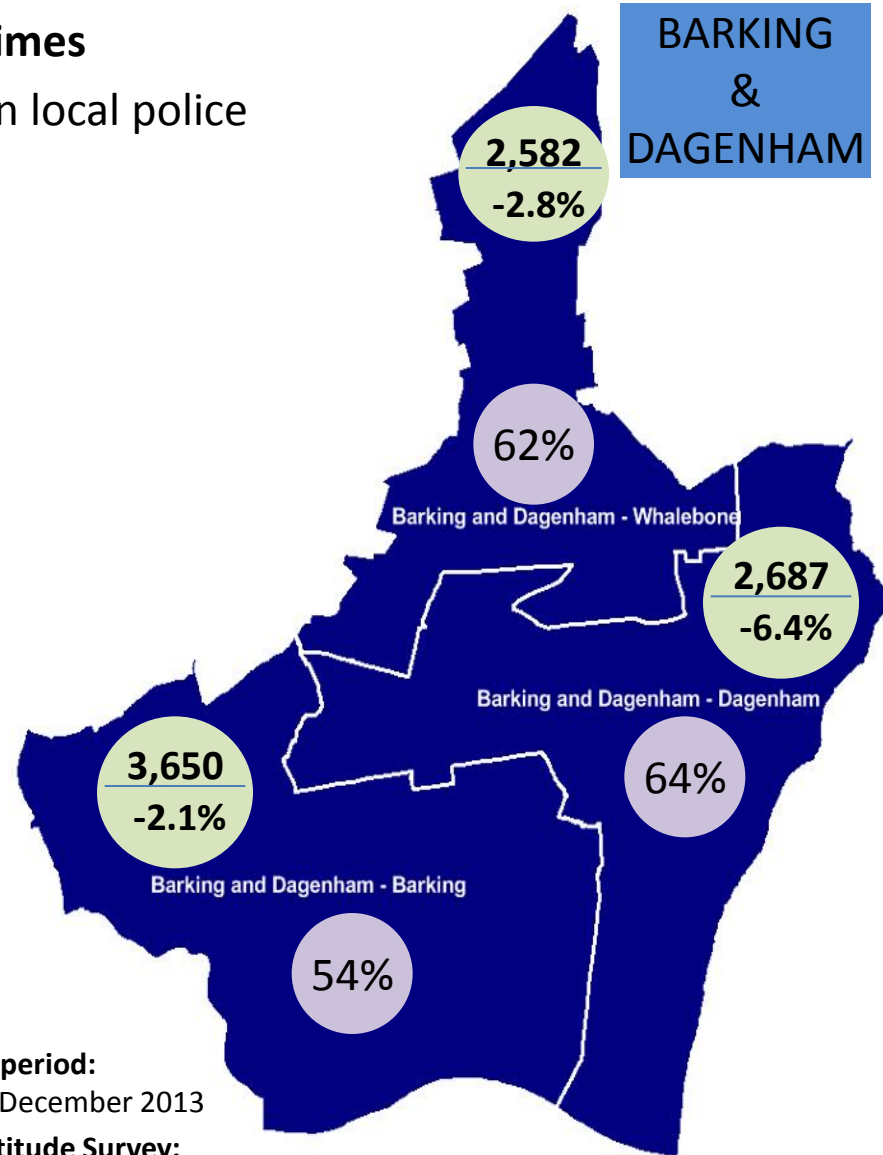

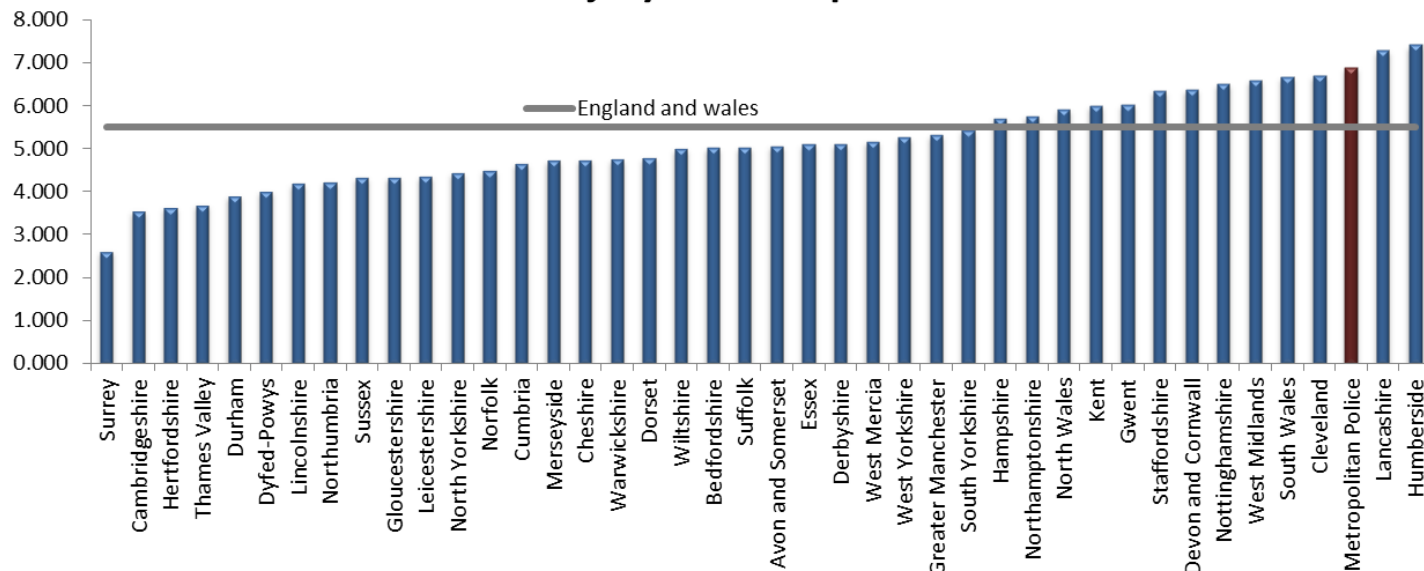

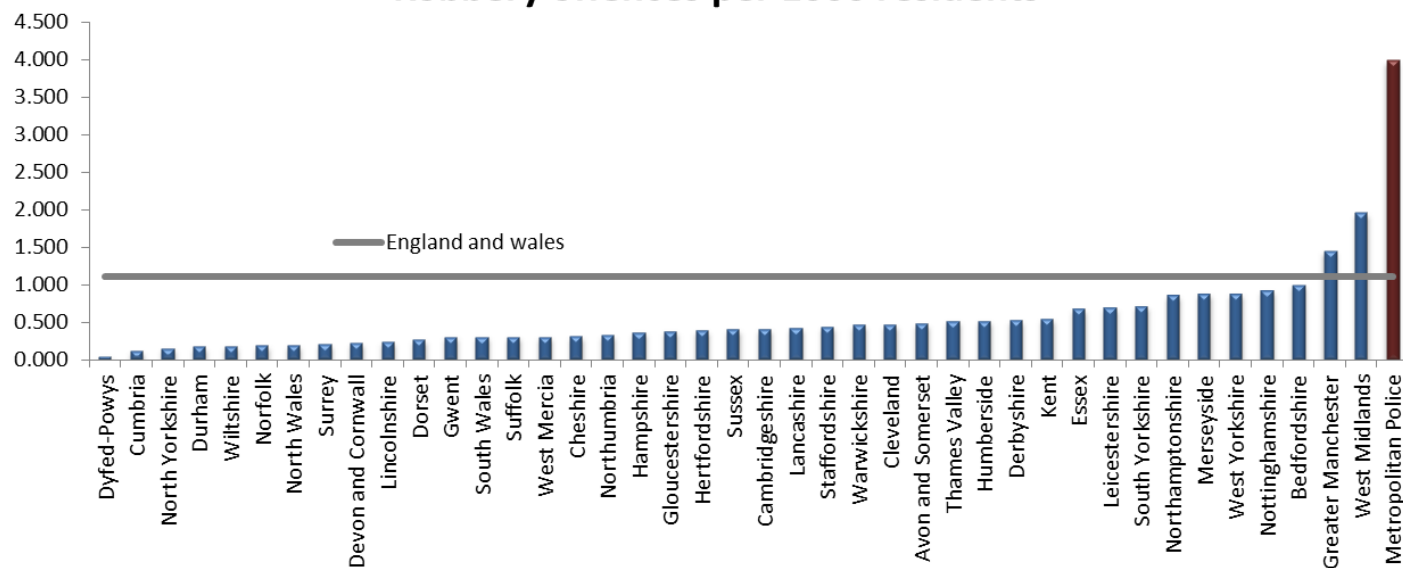

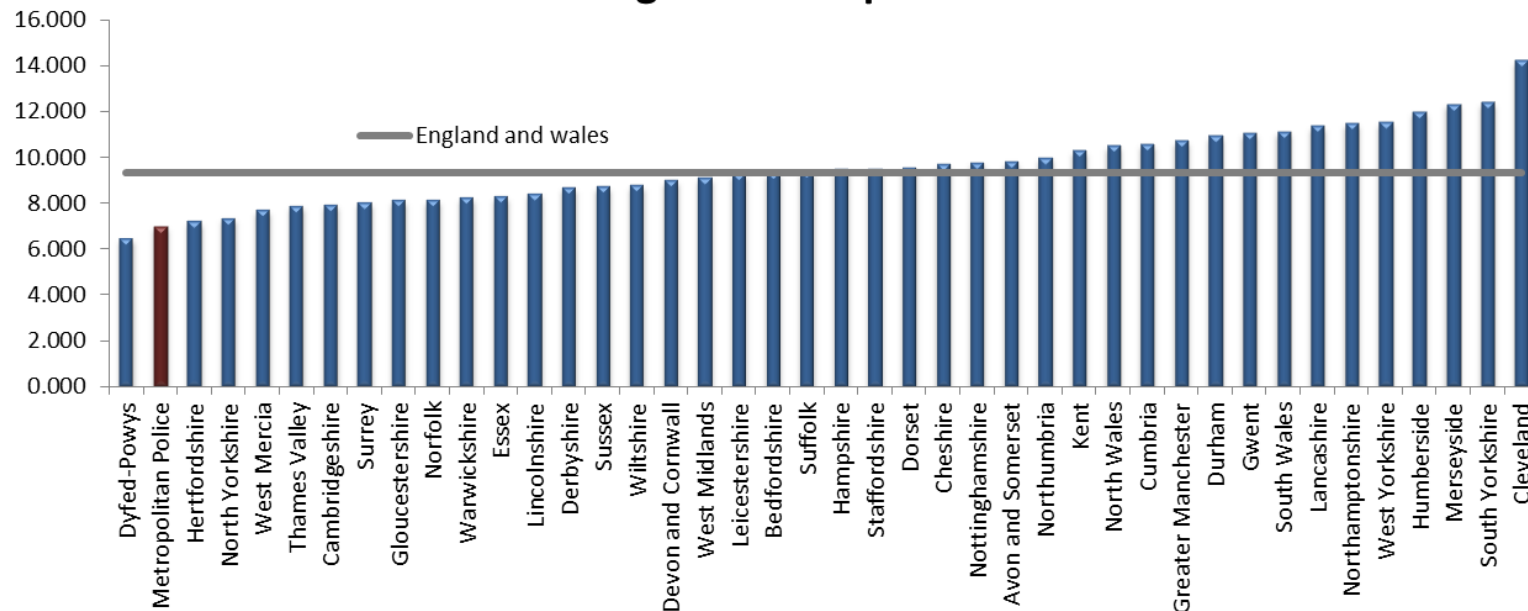

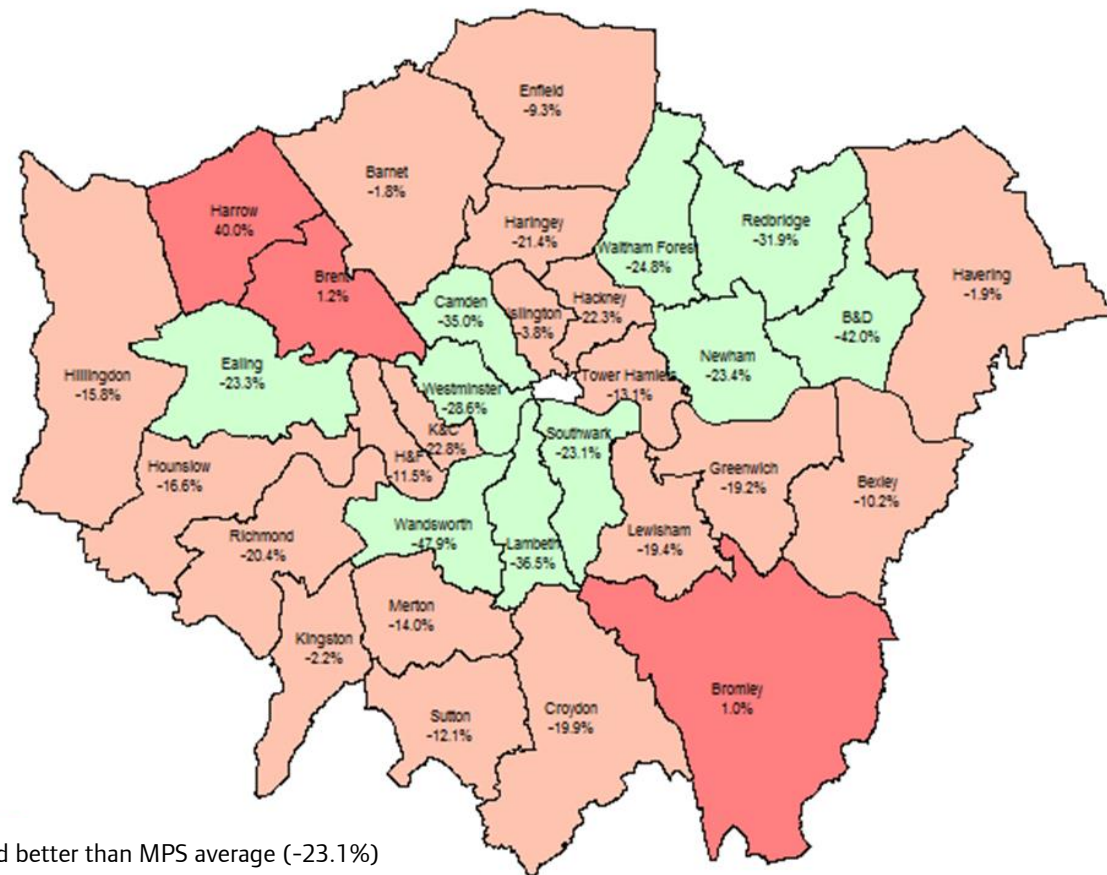

The thematic map shows borough comparison for percentage change over the last 3 months (Oct 2013– Dec 2013) as compared with the same 3-month period last year



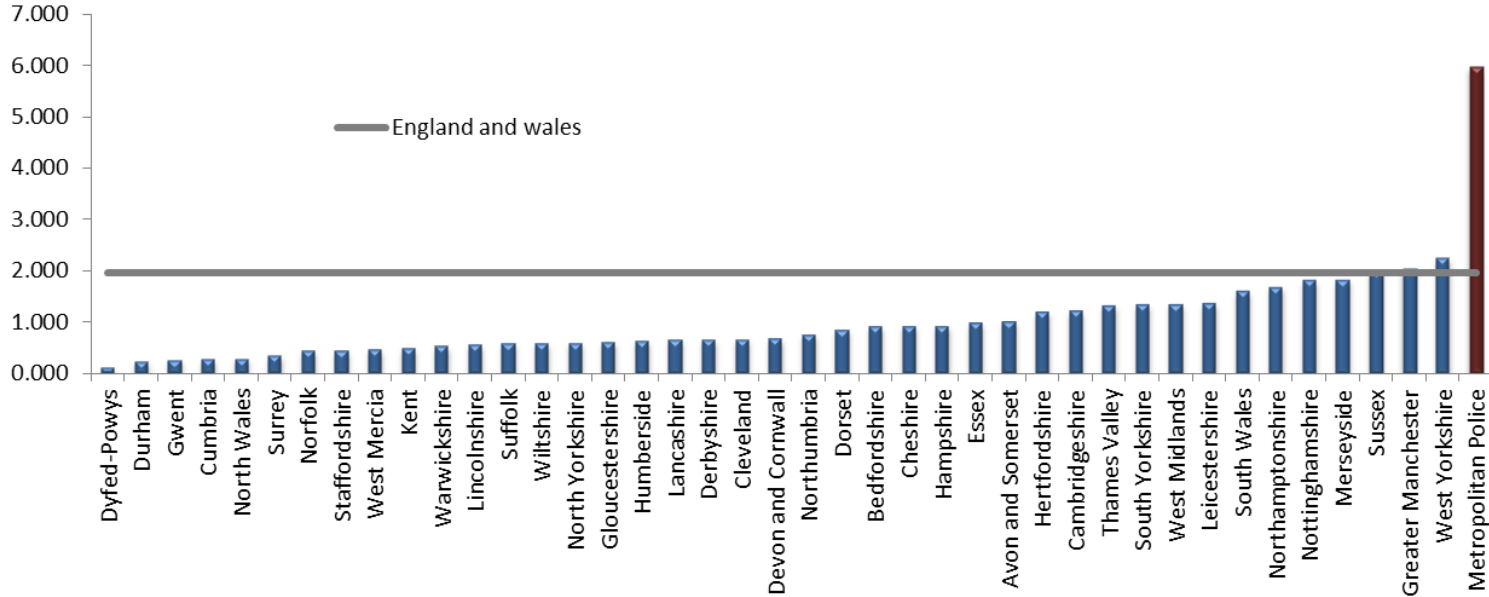

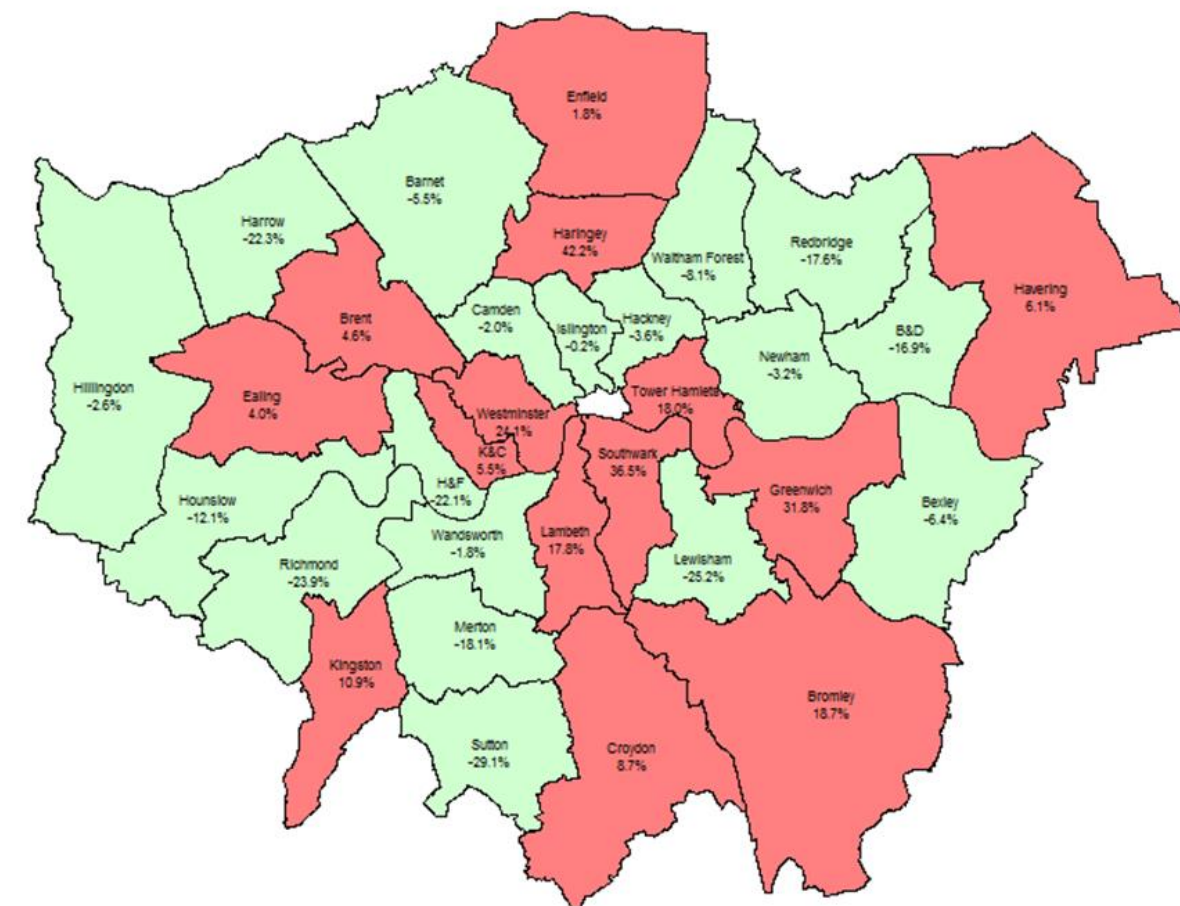

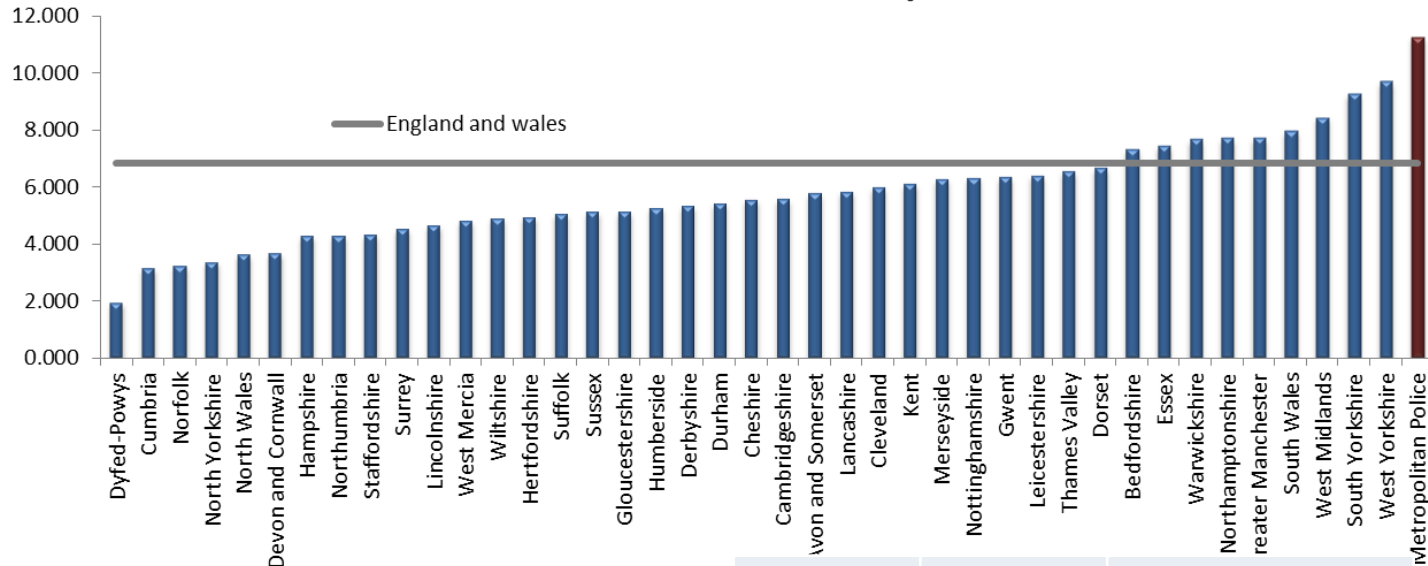

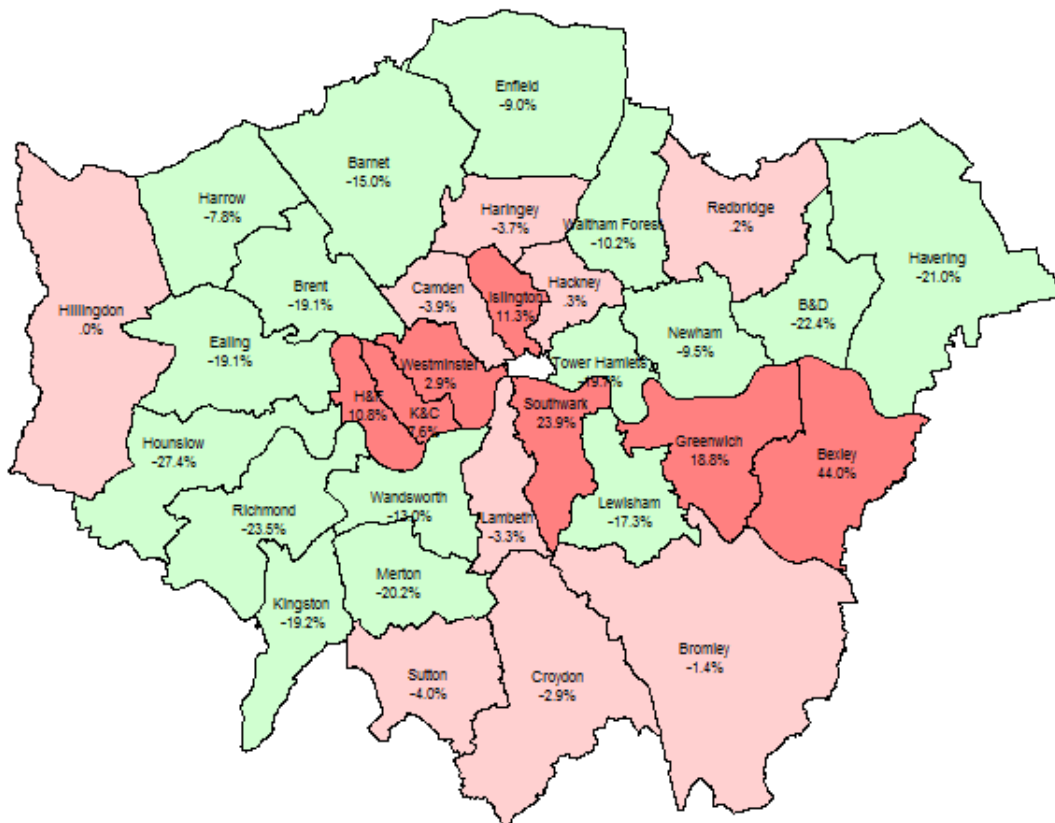

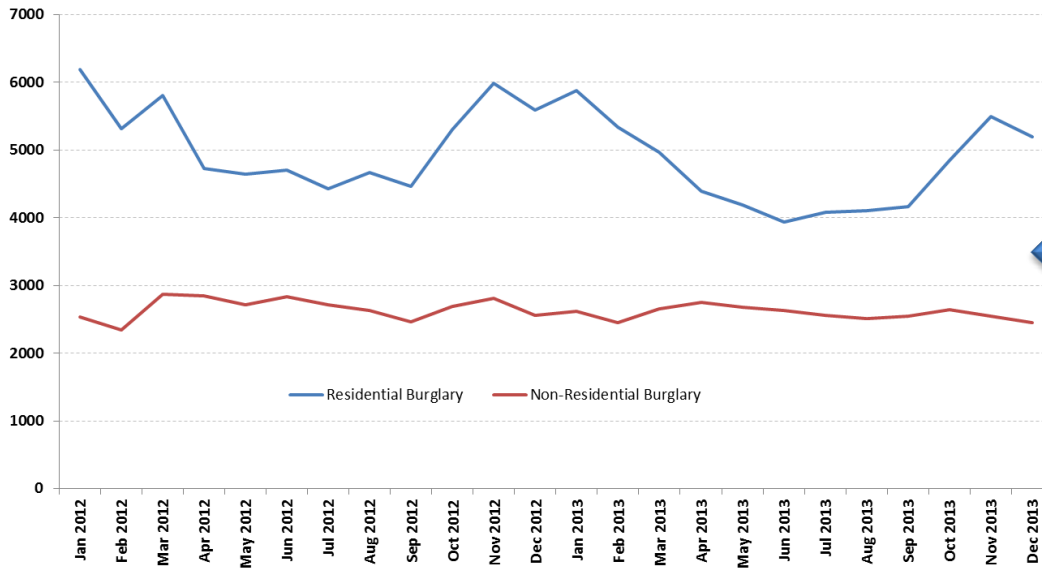

Residential & Non-residential Burglaries trend over the last 24 months



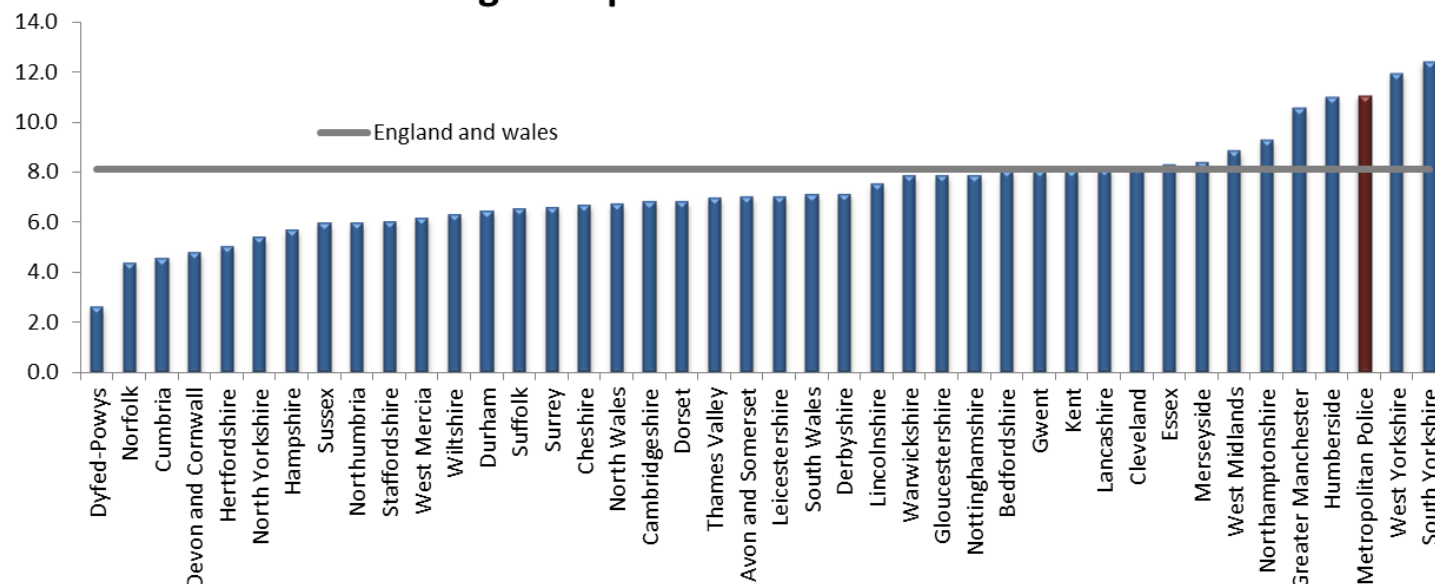
Burglary is currently on course to reach the MOPAC 20% reduction target.
