
Sets out policy to deliver and support a new town centre hierarchy, that offers a range of town centre uses, serving the needs of the development and that complements surrounding town centres



Development Management Town Centre and Community Use Policies

Sets out different policies as follows:

Policy TCC1: map of existing and proposed town centres and town centre uses



Policy TCC4: map of proposed social infrastructure

- **TCC1 -** support the role and function of OPDC's designated town centres
- **TCC2** support vibrant town centres by maximising active frontages, support outdoor uses and manage the delivery of new betting shops, pawnbrokers, payday loan stores and games arcades
- TCC3 deliver A-class uses to serve the needs of the area and complement existing town centres
- **TCC4** secure a range of high quality social infrastructure facilities for existing and new residents and workers
- **TCC5** support the provision of a high quality cultural offer and cultural quarter in Old Oak
- **TCC6** support the provision of high quality sports and leisure facilities
- **TCC7** manage the loss of public houses
- **TCC8** manage the delivery of catalyst uses
- **TCC9** support meanwhile uses to bring life and activity to an area and support \bullet longer-term regeneration and development proposals
- **TCC10** contribute to London's visitor infrastructure and London's overall need for an additional 40,000 high quality hotel bedspaces by 2036
- **TCC11 -** manage hours of operation of town centre uses to minimise their impact on residential amenity
