The policy does not however reference a safe travel environment to ensure this access is feasible. This is particularly important in ensuring gypsy and traveller communities can integrate in a secure and inclusive way.	n/a

Depending how these measures are implemented and managed, they could contribute to positive feelings about the local environment and while unlikely to result in high density development, the policy is suited to making better, more efficient and sustainable use of land. The policy also broadly supports improved access to London's social and economic opportunities, which could help to promote job creation and localised regeneration.	n/a

Appropriate and secure accommodation may also help to overcome barriers to educational and wider employment opportunities. While barriers to employment can be minimised through these measures, the policy does not address the provision of employment in relation to gypsy and traveller sites.	n/a
