- c) Are the provisions in Policy SI3 relating to energy masterplans and major development proposals within Heat Network Priority Areas justified? Is the sequence and content of the heating hierarchy justified having regard, amongst other things, to greenhouse gas emissions?
- d) Would Policy SI4 adequately address overall thermal comfort?
