

Voucher terms

Voucher codes are valid from 1 January – 31 December 2018.

Throughout 2018, you can use your voucher code to register your students for free at www.crestawards.org/register. This year will be a pilot of the Mayor's London Scientist programme. If successful, we hope to extend it in 2019.

Voucher codes are only valid for CREST Awards at SuperStar, Discovery and Bronze level.

The levels we are funding cover ages 7–14. This is because we want to reach students before they start making subject choices at GCSE, A-level and in apprenticeships.

Only your school can use your voucher code.

Please do not share it more widely. Use by non-eligible schools may result in the code being deactivated.

You must complete all data fields when registering students – such as gender, ethnicity and disabilities.

This will help us to evaluate how successful the programme is at reaching those students that will benefit most. If data is not given, we cannot provide evidence of impact and will be unable to continue the programme in 2019.

Data submitted is covered by the British Science Association's privacy policy (www.crestawards.org/privacy). The Greater London Authority will not have access to data that can identify students, such as names or dates of birth.

There is funding available for up to 5,000 students in 2018.

Funding is on a first-come, first-served basis. We have worked closely with the British Science Association to predict demand in London and to provide adequate funding for this.

For Discovery and Bronze Award levels, please include 'Mayor's London Scientist' in project titles.

Due to different processing systems, this ensures the correct certificates are issued.

Eligibility

Any school that meets one or more of the following criteria is eligible for funding:

- schools with 75 per cent+ black and minority ethnic pupils
- schools with 30 per cent+ Pupil Premium
- Special Educational Needs schools
- Alternative Providers and Pupil Referral Units

Fee-charging schools and those that have already taken part in CREST awards in the last three years are not eligible.
