A once in a lifetime regeneration and development project to create a new place for all Londoners




The Old Oak and Park Royal Development Corporation (OPDC) was established by the Mayor of London to oversee the delivery of 25,500 new homes and generate 65,000 new jobs for London.

Over the next 30+ years, we want to make sure that both current and future residents and businesses benefit from the significant investment in the area by the Elizabeth Line (formerly named Crossrail) and High Speed 2 (HS2).

As the local planning authority and future major landowner for the area, we'll maximise this potential by:

- transforming and developing the Old Oak area
- strengthening and regenerating Park Royal
- protecting and sensitively improving Wormwood Scrubs
- enhancing the Grand Union Canal

With three new stations, two station upgrades, and new bus, walking and cycling networks. residents and visitors will be able to travel across London and beyond with ease.

We're keen to ensure the area contributes to London's diverse cultural fabric, with an exciting arts scene for both local residents and visitors to enjoy.

Park Royal: protecting and enhancing



With over 1,700 businesses. the area employs more than 43,000 people. We want to enhance the business area to make sure it carries on being the UK's largest and most successful industrial estate



25,500 new homes being built

- We're at the very beginning of this long project and are developing a plan for how best to deliver these homes
- Developments will be required to provide a mix of affordable housing, including homes to rent and buy, housing for smaller and larger families and specialised housing to meet the needs of older people, disabled people and students
- In 2016 the Mayor of London approved our first planning application to build 605 homes, of which 40% will be affordable



65,000 new jobs being created

- We're working to ensure local people are given priority access to apprenticeships, skills training and jobs by working with local authorities, apprenticeships and job brokerage services
- The sectors these jobs could be made up of include: construction, education, health, commercial and retail, and tourism and leisure and more

Social _____ infrastructure:

health centres, schools and community facilities

- As part of the regeneration, new social infrastructure facilities will be built that are accessible for all residents
- We'll work with the three surrounding boroughs of Brent, Ealing and Hammersmith & Fulham and other partners to deliver these facilities

Department for Transport agrees in principle to transfer key Departmental and Network Rail land to OPDC



August 2016

Mayor of London approves first planning application to build 605 homes



Summer 2017

Final Local Plan goes forward to examination in public by an independent inspector



Autumn 2017

Detailed design-led masterplan for Old Oak published



Early 2020s

Two new London Overground stations to open

High Speed 2 (HS2), the Elizabeth line (formerly Crossrail) and the Great Western Mainline interchange 'superhub station' opens



4 February

First Draft Local Plan public consultation began



First Draft Local Plan consultation ends. Comments are reviewed and fed into the planning process


