This is particularly important for residents in dense, urban areas. Depending on the type of play provision and open space, they could play a role in providing quiet spaces, particularly within central urban areas where lower income families may live. The policy is unlikely to minimise noise and vibration levels overall, as there is no reference to development restrictions, or direct mitigation of existing impacts.
