



Strategic Coordination Summit

Thursday 14th November 2019 at The Oval, London, SE11 5SS (09:30-16:00)

Background

The London Resilience Partnership, in collaboration with the Counter Terrorism Preparedness Network (CTPN) and the UK Home Office (Office for Security and Counter Terrorism), are hosting a one day strategic coordination summit on Thursday 14th November 2019 at The Oval, London.

The summit will focus on counter terrorism consequence management. Consequence management usually takes place in parallel to, and continues beyond, the response to an incident. It is concerned with the wider implications for communities and cities as a whole rather than on-scene operations.

The summit will consist of input from guest speakers, including the former Police Commissioner for Boston who will reflect on the 2013 Boston Marathon attacks, and Dr Idit Albert on post-traumatic stress and the implications for public services following London Terrorist Incidents.

It will further include a facilitated table-top exercise based on an attack at a major event and a transport hub. This will consider the ripple effects and community impacts of such and seek to identify how these can be minimised and arrangements developed to aid multi-agency planning, response and recovery.

Delegates will also receive copies of five strategic reports related to counter terrorism preparedness and consequence management, released by CTPN.

Aim and Objectives

The aim of the strategic coordination summit is to bring together strategic representatives from across London and partnering cities to enhance their understanding of preparedness and consequence management relating to a terrorist attack at a major event. The objectives are to:

- Understand the complexities associated with responding to and recovering from a terrorist attack at a major event and the protection measures/arrangements that can be put in place;
- Raise awareness of the implications of a terrorist attack through the exploration of a scenario;
- Focus on consequence management to distil demands, priorities and actions in this context;
- Learn from the experiences of the participating cities and consider how they may be applied;
- Identify the key strategic issues, dependencies and expectations across organisations;
- Inform the development of city arrangements, plans and procedures.

Joining Instructions

Address: The Kia Oval, Surrey County Cricket Club, Harleyford Road, Kennington, London, SE11 5SS.

Entrance: The entrance to the Kia Oval is through the **Hobbs Gate which is closest to Oval Station.**

Public Transport:

Oval Station: Take the Northern line to Oval underground station. Turn left out of the station and continue walking along Harleyford Road and the Oval is on the right hand side. The Hobbs Gate is situated on the closest corner of the ground (5-10 minutes walk).

Vauxhall Station: Take the Victoria line to Vauxhall underground station. When leaving the station walk through the tunnel towards Kennington and down Harleyford Road to the right. The Kia Oval can be seen on the left and the Hobbs Gate is on the far corner (10-15 minutes walk). For national rail, take South West trains to Vauxhall Station and follow the directions detailed above.

By Bus: Route Numbers 36, 185 and 436 all stop outside the ground.

On Arrival: Report to the main reception via the Hobbs Gate, where delegates will be directed to the Long Room. Delegates will be welcomed and registered by members of London Resilience Group and directed towards their designated tables.
