Terms and conditions Mayor's Entrepreneur 2017

- 1. Entry is only open to students living in London and registered at a London College or University in 2016 or 2017. Students who graduated in June 2016 are eligible. Finalists will need to be able to provide proof of student status in 2016 and proof of address in London.
- 2. If you are using your work computer you may need to obtain your employer's permission prior to entering.
- 3. Entries to the Competition should be made via the online application form. Additional information may be submitted to support an application but these files must be compatible with a standard windows system. Video files must be in one of the following formats (.MPG, .MOV, .WMV, and .RM formats only.). Entries must be submitted by midnight on 12th February 2017.
- 4. Members of the competition delivery team and their families are not eligible to enter the competition.
