

Terms and conditions Mayor's Entrepreneur 2019

1. Entry is only open to students living in London and registered at a London College or University in 2018 or 2019. Students who graduated in December 2017 are eligible. Semi-finalists and finalists will need to be able to provide proof of student status in 2018/9 and proof of address in London.
2. If you are using your work computer you may need to obtain your employer's permission prior to entering.
3. Entries to the Competition should be made via the online application form. Additional information may be submitted to support an application but these files must be compatible with a standard windows system. Video files must be in one of the following formats (.MPG, .MOV, .WMV, and .RM formats only.). Entries must be submitted by February 2019
4. Members of the competition delivery team and their families are not eligible to enter the competition.
5. The GLA or its contractors shall not be responsible for late, lost or delayed entries or network, computer hardware or software failures of any kind that may delay or restrict entry into the competition.
6. There is no limit to the number of entries which may be made by any individual or group or any combination thereof.
7. Each individual idea can only be entered under one award
8. The Competition begins on 3 October 2018 ("the Opening Date") and runs until midnight on 17 February 2019("the Closing Date").
9. By entering an application and providing a contact email address, entrants opt in to receive future email alerts about this programme and any further iterations of it. Eligible applicants will also receive invitations to future Mayor's Entrepreneur events. Email addresses will only be used for communications about this programme and will not be shared within the wider GLA or with any third-party organisations.
10. There is a total of £20,000 development funding to be awarded to the best idea or ideas for each of the three awards. The development funding will be held by the GLA or a nominated partner and must be used to further develop the ideas and prepare them for market. In accepting the award, the winners agree to sign a standard terms and conditions contract available here. Winners have 1 year to spend their development fund. The initial winner's idea development must be linked to London.
11. The winner[s] will be judged by a panel of experts who will select a group of 30 semi-finalists from each award. From there the top 5 from each award will be chosen and go forward to pitch to a high-profile judging panel and will be judged against the criteria available on the homepage page of the competition website.
12. Winners will be announced at the Award Ceremony to be held at London City Hall in April 2019. The names and universities of winners and finalists will be posted on the Greater London Authority website.
13. Winners and finalists may be required to take part in promotional activities in the year following the Award Ceremony.
14. The Promoter of the competition is the GLA of City Hall, the Queen's Walk, London, SE1 2AA. The judges' decision is final and binding in all matters and no correspondence will be entered into surrounding this decision.
15. The Promoter reserves the right to substitute any prizes with a prize of equivalent or higher value in the event of circumstances outside of its control. There is no cash alternative to prizes.

16. Entry into the Competition implies acceptance of these terms and conditions. The GLA reserves the right to refuse to award prizes to anyone found to be in breach of these terms and conditions.
17. The GLA, Mayor's Entrepreneur Delivery Team and all Judges agree not to disclose any Confidential Information to any third party without the prior written consent of the other Parties and applicants, unless they are required by law to reveal the information.
18. All applications will be considered Confidential. Titles of winning entries and brief descriptions approved by the applicants may be used in publicity of the Prize.
19. The intellectual property of any submitted ideas will remain with the applicant and any arrangements they have made with their group or previously involved parties
