

Skill-UP

In June 2015, Team London launched the Skill-UP programme to address the skills gap. It brings together industry-leading organisations to create free training modules and offer long-term support for charity staff.

Skill-UP offers **training** modules in the following areas:

- **Communications and Public Relations** in partnership with Portland
- **Engaging with Business** in partnership with Natixis
- **Finance** in partnership with Citi
- **Human Resources** in partnership with the CIPD
- **Social Media** in partnership with Twitter



Measuring the Good

~~We recognise charities face increasing pressure from funders, beneficiaries and government to provide value for money.~~ The first step to helping an organisation be more efficient is to focus on its mission and ensure it measures its results. This programme helps organisations do that by matching skilled volunteers to charities that want to better understand and communicate their impact.

The programme was developed by Coalition for Efficiency and Volunteering Matters. **Run by Team London it will:**

- Match your charity with a skilled mentor who can help you record your impact and refine your mission
- Help you to be more competitive when applying for funding and awards
- Give you a free resource to help track your impact

Trustee Training

Trustees are critical to a charity’s success. At Team London we are passionate about ensuring trustees are properly supported in this role. To achieve this, we are working with Greater London Volunteering to offer the following free programmes:

- **Introduction to Trusteeship** – ideal for those considering becoming a trustee or are new to trusteeship
- **Trustee Masterclass** – an opportunity for existing trustees to build skills, refresh their knowledge and share experiences
- **Trustee Conference** – an opportunity to keep up with changes in the sector and get your questions answered

Small Grants Innovation Fund

We provide a number of small grants annually to London charities to encourage innovation in volunteer management and recruitment. These grants are designed to enable charities to pilot new ways of working, engage with diverse groups of volunteers and support local impact initiatives.

Charity Delivery Partners


Many Team London programmes are run in partnership with the third sector. When a new programme requires a delivery partner, we invite London’s third sector to tender.
